## 7wenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary 7ime SEPTEMBER 11, 2022

Exodus 32:7-11,13-14; 1 Timothy 1:12-17; Luke 15:1-32

The God of the Old Testament is the same as the God of the New Testament. But at times he is perceived differently. Our first reading tells of the rebellion and idolatry of the Israelites in the desert. God mercifully brought them out of slavery in Egypt.

But while Moses is on Mt. Sinai receiving the Holy Torah, the Israelites make a golden calf and adore it as their god! God wants to destroy this rebellious people, but Moses intercedes and calls on God to remember that he is the God of mercy.

The Gospel gives parables of the mercy of God. He searches for the lost (i.e. the sinner) until he finds and brings back. God always takes the first step to reach out to the sinner in order to show mercy and forgiveness.

In the second reading, Paul says that he does not deserve God's mercy since he was an arrogant blasphemer and persecutor. But God showed him mercy.

How do we handle our sins? Do we try to run and hide? Do we rationalize and pretend that we have never sinned? Do we leave the Church and accuse the Church of wrongdoing? Or do we realize that God still loves us and wants to forgive us.

His great sacrament of mercy is always available. But we must accept his mercy. We must admit our sins and resolve that we shall never turn our backs on him again. God searches us out to show us his mercy. How do we act when we are forgiven? Let us show such gratitude that we shall never sin again.

#### Dear Parishioners,


As I was writing this particular column, I was suddenly struck with the number in the ordinary time, 25th Sunday. The reason that this intrigued me was the fact that as this number increases each weekend, it means that this ordinary time will be coming to an end. In fact, 33rd Sunday is the last Sunday before the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King. With that celebration, then we begin the season of Advent, something that I don't want to consider in the month of September. So we will leave it at that.

In our gospel today, we hear of the parable of what is called the "unjust steward." This particular person was the manager of am owner's business. He was in complete charge. He could doctor the books and manipulate the invoices. Apparently that was happening, as he was reported for, as the gospel states, "squandering the property." As he was about to be fired, he ended up using his ingenuity for himself as he was preparing to lose his job. Right or wrong, the master or owner commended this dishonest person for taking care of himself for the future. The moral of this particular parable is that if only we as stewards of God's gifts could act prudently in the same way, not for ourselves but rather in proclaiming the kingdom of God, we could actually make that kingdom a reality in our world. Then in this same parable, Jesus reminds us that "No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon." This is a challenge for all of us to determine whom we will serve with our gift of time, talents, and treasures.

This week the priests will be gathered for their annual convocation of priests in Collinsville, Illinois, from Monday night, September 19 to Thursday afternoon, September 22. All diocesan priests are expected to be present for this convocation. In fact, the meeting on Tuesday night is what they call the corporate talk by the bishop and all pastors must be present for this meeting. There will be sessions during the morning with some afternoons free, followed by a dinner and social in the evenings. Because of our absence, THERE WILL BE NO MASSES ON TUESDAY, WEDNESAY, AND THURSDAY MORNINGS NOR WILL THERE BE A MASS AT QND ON TUESDAY AND THURSDAY OF NEXT WEEK. I will be back for the football Mass on late Thursday afternoon. In our absence, I ask you to pray for us as I will be praying for you. In case of emergency, our parish staff will be able to get a hold of us.

On Tuesday, September 27, all the Catholic schools in the Quincy region will be gathering together at QND gym to celebrate our annual All Catholic School's Mass at 9:30 a.m. Any of our parents are welcome to attend. This annual celebration is a beautiful reflection of who we are as Catholic schools, celebrating and being strengthened by the Eucharist which is the center of our faith. It's also a reflection of our mission as the great evangelizing tool of each parish as we bring and live the message of the gospel to others. And our gathering shows the great gift that has been handed down to us, a Catholic school system from pre-school to 12 years of Catholic education. God bless all of you for making this happen.
