### From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **26<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time.** In the gospel story Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus. Both men die, and the two find their fortunes reversed in the afterlife. Lazarus enjoys comfort whereas the rich man is tormented. The rich man hopes that someone might be sent back to warn his family. Abraham simply says, "They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them." The fullness of our Catholic faith - in our Scriptures, liturgy, sacraments, and moral teaching - presents us with everything we need for salvation. These bring us the life of Jesus Christ. Nothing more is necessary to prepare us for the "bosom of Abraham."

Next weekend (October 1-2) our parish Finance Council will present the **Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2021-22.** Members of the Finance Council are making a brief presentation at each of our Sunday Masses. We thank the Finance Council for their good work in overseeing the financial operations of our parish.

Next weekend Blessed Sacrament will begin our October Count of all persons attending Mass on the weekends of October. These numbers assist the Springfield Diocese in their continued efforts of pastoral planning.

Finally, **beginning next weekend**, as a means to concluding the discussion on which Weekend Evening (Saturday or Sunday) should be the parish's weekend evening Mass, we are going to have an official **"Vote with our Feet."** For **8 weeks (Saturday, October 1 to Sunday, November 20)**, we are going to celebrate both Weekend Masses and count the attendance at both of these Masses:

### Saturday, 4:30 p.m. Mass Sunday, 5:00 p.m. Mass

At the end of those 8 weeks, the Mass with the highest Mass count will become the parish's weekend evening Mass. The First Sunday of Advent (November 26-27) will have in place the Mass schedule of whatever has been chosen. Thank you to all the ministers who will be putting in extra work for these 8 weeks of 4-Mass weekends. Your time and help is very much appreciated.

To the left of the sanctuary is the shrine of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We honor St. Joseph as the guardian and protector of Jesus and Mary. By trade he was a carpenter and would have taught those skills to Jesus. We honor St. Joseph on March 19 as the Husband of Mary and May 1 as St. Joseph the Worker. He is the patron saint of the Universal Church, of a happy death, and of workers. Our statue shows him holding a lily to symbolize his purity and indicate that he was of the House of David.

## FACTS ABOUT CHILDHOOD CANCER

Cancer is one of the leading causes of death among children and adolescents worldwide; approximately 280,000 children ages 0-19 are diagnosed with cancer each year. In Latin America and the Caribbean, it is estimated that at least 29,000 children and adolescents under the age of 19 will be affected by cancer annually. Of these, about 10,000 will die from this disease.

- In high-income countries, more than 80% of children with cancer are cured, but in many low-and middle-income countries, the cure rate is about 20%.
- The impact of childhood cancer translates into years of life lost, more significant inequalities, and economic difficulties. This situation can and should change.
