

This week's parable is sometimes called "Dives and Lazarus." While the rich man has no name in the Gospel, he is often called by the title *"dives,"* which means "rich one." On the other hand, the poor man is forever memorialized as "Lazarus," whose name in Hebrew means *"God will help."* Similar to last week's gospel, we are reminded that both will be called to account and that life is short. The moral of the story would appear to be


that "justice will be served," in that we see that the rich man who was indifferent to the beggar's suffering, himself, will be consigned to flames, while the poor man enjoys eternal bliss.

But as Christians, our interpretation of this parable is more profound than to simply suggest that there is a balancing act in the divine economy of good and evil. If a man suffers in this life and knows that his sufferings will bring about joy in the life to come, should the beggar not rejoice in his sufferings, knowing that he is on the "right side" of divine justice in this world? And if he is on the "right side" of divine justice, is not this world an expression of the kingdom being present in this world? The beatitudes suggest as much ... "blessed are the poor in spirit...blessed are the meek and humble of heart...blessed are the single-hearted... blessed are you when you are persecuted for my sake...the kingdom of heaven is yours!" Conversely, being the recipient of graces in this world might strike fear into the heart of those who have resources and aspire to eternal salvation. What do we make of this? The Lord does wish to save all people...both the poor and the rich. But salvation is not won by simply being poor or even by giving away all one owns for the needs of the poor. Our parable seems to indicate that what is most important is to avoid indifference to the coming of the Kingdom and the Jubilee announced by Christ. This is seen not only in attentiveness to the needs of the poor on the part of people of faith, but also by living the virtue of "Moses and the Prophets" who proclaim justice for the poor and oppressed.



Starting on Wednesday, September 28, and running until the week before Thanksgiving, we will offer the *Wisdom: God's Vision for Life* scripture study course by Jeff Cavins and Ascension Press. We will start the course, interrupted by COVID in 2020, over from the beginning. There is a journal available for the course which is recommended but not totally necessary. If you would like us to order one, please call the Parish Office at 217-222-5996. There is no cost, but donations will be accepted. This course will focus on the "wisdom literature" of the Bible, including the book of Wisdom, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Sirach. All are invited!

We will also have a 6:00 p.m. **Mass on Wednesday evening** at St. Anthony's during the duration of the course. All are welcome for Mass, whether taking the course or not!



The Chaplaincy Office at Blessing Hospital is in need of new people to step forward to be Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for patients in the hospital. Since COVID, many volunteers have chosen to retire and do other things, and so Catholic patients are not always able to receive Holy Communion each day, as they have in the past. Those who are engaged in this ministry are recommended and commissioned by their parish and then Blessing Hospital provides the required training for infection control, privacy rights, and other hospital procedures. Many ministers go on a weekly basis, but they would be happy to have assistance even if you can only go once a month or on weekends or another schedule. 
