Today we celebrate the **24th Sunday of Ordinary Time**. In the gospel story Jesus tells the parable of the Lost Sheep and the Lost Coin. The shepherd leaves 99 sheep in the pasture in search of the one lost sheep that has strayed. And upon finding the lost sheep shares his joy with all of his neighbors. The parable is about God's mercy. Our Lord goes to great efforts to keep us connected to Him. The conversions (and ongoing conversions) that occur in our life are a continued source of joy for the Lord.

This weekend is **Septemberfest!!!** On Saturday we are kicking off our annual Parish Festival with a **4:00 p.m. Saturday Mass**. This will be a **"Blue Mass"** to honor our **Quincy community's First Responders: Fire, Police, and EMT's**. Great food, games, and entertainment are planned for this weekend's event.

Next Sunday, September 18, is **Catechetical Sunday**. Next Sunday the Universal Church recognizes and blesses all those involved in sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ in many varied parish and school ministries. Here at Blessed Sacrament at all weekend Masses, we will honor and bless leaders and participants in the following parish/school catechetical ministries:

Prior to COVID, we used to have enough Eucharistic ministers to have two a day covering this ministry. Now, we are lucky to get one or two a week. So let's see what we can do to begin anew with the Eucharist daily for our Catholic patients.

Finally, as a means to concluding the discussion on which Weekend Evening (Saturday or Sunday) should be the parish's weekend evening Mass, we are going to have an official **"Vote with our Feet."** For **8 weeks (Saturday, October 1, to Sunday, November 20)** we are going to celebrate both Weekend Masses and count the attendance at both of these Masses:

Saturday, 4:30 p.m. Mass
Sunday, 5:00 p.m. Mass

At the end of those 8 weeks, the Mass with the highest Mass count will become the parish's weekend evening Mass. The First Sunday of Advent (November 26-27) will have in place the Mass schedule of whatever has been chosen. Thank you to all the ministers who will be putting in extra work for these 8 weeks of 4-Mass weekends. Your time and help is very much appreciated.

When returning the bag, please keep the holy card and the candle. The next person to pick up the bag will have a new candle to take with them.

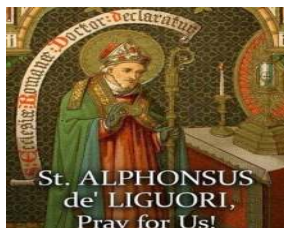
To volunteer, please use the sign-up sheet that will be in the Gathering Space each week. You may choose which week you would like. Thank you for your many prayers for the unborn.

Our Church History

St. Alphonsus Liguori was born in Naples in 1696. He was a lawyer but left the legal profession and entered the priesthood. Later he founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, commonly known as the Redemptorists. To make people better Christians he spent much time preaching and writing books on moral theology. He was chosen bishop but soon resigned his office to work simply as a priest. He died in 1787 and his feast day is August 1. Our statue portrays Alphonsus with the symbols of a bishop. St. Alphonsus was known as a gentle and loving priest. He is the Patron Saint of Arthritis. His best known work, *The Way of the Cross*, is still used in parishes during Lenten devotions.
