

"On the Q/T..."

From A Simple Path, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, by Lucinda Varney: "I always say that love starts at home: family first, and then your own town or city. It is easy to love people who are far away but it is not always so easy to love those who live with us or right next to us. I do not agree with the big way of doing things - love needs to start with an individual. To get to love a person, you must contact that person, become close. Everyone needs love. All must know that they are wanted, and that they are important to God."

Of course, we're talking about Missionaries of Charity, here. Saint Teresa of Calcutta's community is based on transformation of humanity by recognizing Christ and responding in simplicity. There's more than one way to take on a world in need of Jesus. But that "love starts at home" part..."it is not so easy to love those who live with us or right next to us." So how about this question: When things are a bit adrift at home, do I realize that *that's* the time to draw closer and show love? As St. John of the Cross said, centuries ago: "Where there is no love, put love, and then you yourself will find love."

GROWING DISCIPLES Bishop Tylka's diocesan discernment process has begun: prayer and dialogue in which we will be participating as we follow the Holy Spirit's lead in the direction of our diocese. We have selected a "Parish Provider of Content," Mr. James Layfield, from St. Mary's Church in Hamilton, to assist the Growing Disciples effort in the initial data gathering needed to see where our churches - and all churches of the diocese - stand, right now. We are in the process of selecting parishioners - one from each church, from Bishop Tylka's previous meeting with our question-and-answer group - to begin dialogue about what makes for a vibrant parish, and what future parish structures should look like. We won't keep you in the dark.


