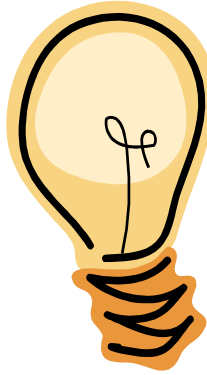

September 11, 2022 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



In just about every modern manufacturing process, there is the concept of an “acceptable loss.” If a company manufactures 100,000 light bulbs, there may be the chance that 1% will be defective or broken by time they make it home. Out of a carton of eggs, every once and a while, one might be broken. Out of every 100 students accepted into college, the administrators know that some certain percentage will fail by the end of the term. Those whose job it is to count such things and make an accounting for the use of resources in companies and retail stores make allowances to accommodate “loss,” “defects,” and “variances”... and this is considered a good business practice.

Allowing “acceptable loss” when manufacturing light bulbs or packaging eggs helps keep costs down. Rather than packaging every light bulb or egg in a super-high tech foam and crush-resistant container, designed by a team of the world’s most-talented engineers, light bulbs come in a simple corrugated paper sleeve and cost about 99¢ apiece. Eggs are found in cheap cartons made of recycled paper product and only cost a couple dollars per dozen. While the packaging might not always preserve the product’s integrity, it is reasonable not to invest too much in it, because otherwise the packaging might cost more than the product itself! Indeed, customers will often encounter defective light bulbs and broken eggs and, rather than going to the trouble of returning to the store and seeking a refund, they will simply throw the broken product away and reach for another one... “acceptable losses” keep things cheap.

Our Gospel today shows us that this notion of allowing “acceptable losses” is not shared by our Lord. If you have 10 coins and lose one? Go and find that lost coin. If you have a hundred sheep and lose one? Go and find that lost sheep — even at the risk of the other 99. In the Kingdom of God, there is *no rate of “acceptable loss.”* The Lord values each and every one of His people and will seek them out and will pay any price for their redemption. *Everyone. Any price.*

There is no sin so great as to ever be “lost” to the grace and mercy of God. By extension, there is no price that will not be paid to bring one of the Lord’s sheep back into communion with the flock. This is an attitude that we are encouraged to adopt as a Church and as a society. When we look at our neighbors, aren’t there temptations to write groups of people off as unworthy of our attention or efforts? What do we think about people in prison for crime? ...those of lower socio-economic status? ...those without a good education or job? ...those from another country or culture? Writing off the “lost,” “damaged” or “defective” sheep as “irredeemable” is not the way of the Lord. And so, this parable reminds us that the Church is a hospital for the sinner, and not a shrine to the righteous. Above all, the Lord longs to rescue sinners and return them to fellowship with the saints in heaven.

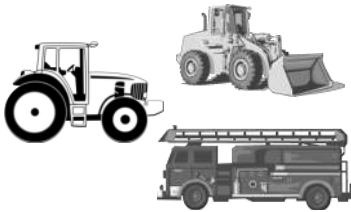

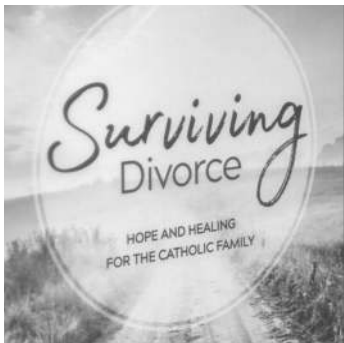
