

"On The Q/T..."

From the devotional God Calling, A.J. Russell ed., the meditation of October 13: "I will indeed help your unbelief, and in answer to your prayers grant you so great a faith, such an increasingly great faith, that each day you may look back, from the place of your larger vision, and see the faith of the day before as almost unbelief....No misspent time over failures and shortcomings. Learn another lesson. The Sculptor who finds a faulty marble casts it aside. Because the marble can't be fashioned, the marble, if it could think, may regard itself as perfect. If it could see, it may look with scorn upon the marble the Sculptor is cutting and shaping into perfection. From this, learn a lesson."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

How about this for a question: Exactly what *is* the lesson to be learned from the parable of the faulty marble?


A Spiritual Communion
