

October 23, Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Am 6:1a, 4-7 / Ps 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 / 1 Tm 6:11-16 / Lk 16:19-3

Who can you most identify with in today's Gospel—the self-glorified Pharisee or the humble, repenting tax collector? Are you an exemplar Catholic on the outside, but on the inside, not so much? Or maybe you are "Uber Catholic"! Is that a bad thing? Only God knows for sure. If the stewardship way of life is easy and comfortable, step it up a notch! If you are not sure where you fall in the spectrum of Catholicity, a good way to assess is to review the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Then, too, we have all the amazing lives of the Saints that we can study and imitate. God is going to meet us where we are at. He wants us to know him, to love him and to serve him in this life so we can spend eternity with him in heaven. So. whether you are Uber Catholic or struggle reciting a Hail Mary, just talk to God, and let him do the heavy lifting.
