Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

OCTOBER 30, 2022

Wisdom 11:22—12:2; 2 Thessalonians 1:11—2:2; Luke 19:1-10

In God's eyes, the entire universe is but a speck of dust. Strangely, however, God cares deeply for everything he has made. He knows each one of us. He loves us individually. He cares for the least significant of us. His almighty power is shown most perfectly in his loving care for the little things.

The Gospel tells us of a "little man" named Zacchaeus. He was short in height and small in virtue. He climbed a sycamore tree to see Jesus pass by in Jericho. Jesus noticed him, invited him to come down, and said that he would dine at Zacchaeus' house! Immediately, Zacchaeus became tall in righteousness because of the mercy of the Lord.

As we approach the end of "Ordinary Time" and the beginning of Advent, our second reading concentrates on the end of the world and the Second Coming of Christ. This world will end. Maybe today. Maybe tomorrow. Christ will come in glory. No one knows when this will happen.

The "signs" of the end took place before the end of the first century; there are no more signs. We should, therefore, live each day as if it is going to be our last day on earth. Don't be frightened, however. Remember the mercy of the Lord. But be sober and watchful. Pray that you may always be ready for the Lord to come.

The Parish of St. Peter Quincy, IL

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 30, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate this last weekend in our month of October, the Church celebrates the 31st Sunday in Ordinary time. I bring this to your attention as there are only 34 Sundays in this designated time that we call "ordinary." What this means is that our liturgical year is rapidly coming to a close, and a new year with the First Sunday of Advent is right around the corner. Even though we anticipate much, we continue to take one day at a time, then one week at a time. And through it all, the Lord is walking with us.

Our first reading for this weekend is from the Book of Wisdom. The very first words we all need to take note as it says, "Before the Lord, the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth." In other words, as Creator, the Lord looks upon His creation as a speck of dust to Him. We are all small and insignificant. Then the writer states: "For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made; for what you hated, you would not have fashioned." In other words, in spite of being small and insignificant, God loves us with an everlasting love. This means He cares about us even when we are sinners. In turn, then, He wants us to reach out to others with His mercy and forgiveness. We see this happening in our gospel. Jesus is in Jericho when he meets a short individual names Zacchaeus, a tax collector and a very wealthy man. As a tax collector, he was labelled as a grave sinner and often rejected by the good people of Jesus' time. First thing that Jesus does as He sees him in a tree, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly for today I must stay at your house." From that statement come the criticisms, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." Then we have the reassuring words of Jesus that provide hope for all of us: "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." Because of our own sins, we can find ourselves in this category which gives us hope.

Next Tuesday, November 1, is a Holy day of Obligation as we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. Our Mass schedule is as follows:

Monday, October 31. Vigil Mass for All Saints: 5:30 p.m.

Tuesday, November 1: Solemnity of All Saints: Masses will be at 8:30 a.m. (children's Mass); 10:00 a.m. (at QND);, 12:10 and 6:00 p.m. Please note that the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Tuesday will be moved to 8:30 a.m.

As we celebrate these Masses, we are reminded of that statement in the Apostles Creed that "we believe in the communion of saints." As I learned this statement, the Church defines this communion as the Church triumphant, those saints in heaven that we celebrate on November 1; those saints who have died and are making themselves ready to enter heaven, what we call the Church suffering (souls in purgatory), whose feast is November 2, All Soul's Day; and the final saints are what is called the Church militant, those of us who are still alive and struggling with sins and imperfections, trying to live as imitators of Jesus. As the Church militant, it is our role then to model our lives around the saints in heaven as well as to remember in prayer the souls in purgatory who need us.


