Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time NOVEMBER 13, 2022

Malachi 3:19-20a; 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12; Luke 21:5-19

The people of the Old Covenant thought that God would render terrible judgment when the Messiah came. Evil would be destroyed in God's purifying fire. But the upright would rise to share eternal life. Our first reading expresses this expectation.

Many of the Thessalonians had quit their jobs and put on their glory robes in anticipation of the Second Coming of Jesus. Paul tells them to get back to work. The end is coming, but we don't know when. Meanwhile, we must work as well as watch and pray.

The Gospel is from Jesus' "Eschatological Sermon," the sermon on the "Last Things." Many Jews thought that the Temple priesthood had become so corrupt that God would destroy the Temple and build a new one. They thought that this would happen at the same time the Messiah came, at the end of the world as we know it.

Some of this expectation carried over into the primitive Church. Jesus says that the Temple will be destroyed, but the end of the world will not happen yet. He says that there will be many false prophets and false messiahs. There will be persecutions and all kinds of signs.

All of these signs took place before the end of the first century, but the end is not yet. But it is coming! Don't be disturbed; there are no new signs. It remains for us to watch and pray – to be ready when the Lord comes in his glory.

Dear Parishioners,

We gather this weekend as the Church is bringing its liturgical year to a close, celebrating the 33rd Sunday. Next weekend is the 34th and last Sunday in this time called "ordinary" and with it being the last Sunday, the Church concludes the year with the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King. As the year comes to a close, the Church challenges us to look at what is called "the end of time." When that end comes, no one knows. But it will come and the Church always challenges us to live our lives prepared for that end. Because when that end comes, there will be Judgment in which all of us will have to give an accounting of our lives before our God. This recognition of the end is not to cause fear but rather an acknowledgement that every one of us will stand before account for our lives. Often we hear all differing kinds of people state boldly that the signs of the end are present in our day and age. They point to wars, various natural disasters, and many other signs that seemingly are present, indicating that this must be the end. But what we have learned from the Scriptures is that: 1. the world will end; 2. no one knows when; 3. the signs of the end of the world took place more than 1900 yeas ago; 4. there are no new signs of the end. So what does all this mean, while we await the end, we live our lives prepared for the final coming of Christ and the end of time.

Last Saturday, we celebrated the Mass of Remembrance, the time as a parish we remembered those of the parish who have died this past year. I always have this fear that during our slide presentation of these deceased members, that we will miss someone. It happened this past weekend. We failed to have a picture of Billy Smith who died this past year, and we failed to identify correctly Bonnie Cress whose picture we displayed but the wrong name. My apologies to the families for this mistake. In light of that, we are correcting our mistake by displaying the correct names and pictures in our bulletin this weekend. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

Last weekend, I had the privilege of preaching at all the Masses, bringing to conclusion our Stewardship Renewal. I am encouraging you to make sure, that you take your commitment forms to prayer, asking God to help you discern His will in filling out the forms. Then, please fill out the forms and return them to the parish office, either through the collection, or via mail or hand deliver them. It is most important to fill in and return as we need you to be a part of our parish family. And hopefully together we continue to embrace and reflect a stewardship parish.

As we look ahead, Thanksgiving Day is Thursday, November 24. As the stewardship parish we profess to be, it is important that the foundation of our stewardship is founded on being a "thankful people." We look at all of our lives and see how God has blessed us with gifts of time, talents, and treasures. As we recognize these gifts, then our response is to be thankful for them to the God who gives to us so many blessings. And what is good as an individual, it is also good as a nation. So please join us on Thanksgiving Day as we gather for the Eucharist, our great thanksgiving prayer, at 9:30 a.m.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

With a population of over 1.1 million inhabitants, the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois has tens of thousands of people within our diocese living below the poverty line. These women, men and children are hungry, homeless, and hurting. Thanks to your donations to the annual Diocesan Campaign for Justice and Hope (DCJH), organizations throughout the diocese are able to give dignity, provide hope and material support to those who live in the margins.

Our annual collection for DCJH will be taken up the weekend of November 19 - 20, 2022. All the funds collected will be given out, through a grant process, to local programs and organizations that give direct aid to the poor and vulnerable. This campaign seeks to address the Gospel command to care for "the least of these" (Matthew 25) and address systemic injustices that contribute to poverty.

I'm asking you to reach out in solidarity to those who suffer and lack basic human necessities. Your support and partnership in the DCJH collection is essential to its success. Please give generously to next week's collection. If you have not contributed before, I hope you will consider being a first-time donor. If you have contributed in the past, consider increasing your gift by a few dollars.

All funds collected are distributed to organizations within our diocesan boundaries that provide help and hope to the poor in accord with Catholic teaching. Last year, 21 organizations were offered grants. It is my hope that this year's collection will increase so that we can meet the needs of even more people living in poverty.
