

#### "On The Q/T..."

From the Thanksgiving Proclamation of President Abraham Lincoln, October 3, 1863: "I do, therefore, invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States...to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens. And I recommend to them that, while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence, for our national perverseness and disobedience...and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty God to heal the wounds of the nation, and to restore it, as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes...."

#### On to the question from Fr. Tony:

The gradual dismantling of our nation's history - instead of reconciling it as our nation progresses through history - is tragic because it's so unnecessary. President Lincoln already provided, in brilliant fashion, a plan for the reconciliation of the history of the United States of America, the good and the bad, the just and the unjust, the newly discovered and the already known. How did he do this? Through the Emancipation Proclamation, the Constitutional Amendment ending slavery, and his second Inaugural Address, he separated the purity and integrity of our founding documents from those founding fathers whose racism tainted them. He took the racism out of the founding documents and pointed to where it always was: in the hearts of racists.

So here's a question for you: How many more non-problems have to be turned into problems before people decide to start brushing up on history? Don't be ashamed of celebrating Thanksgiving Day.

**Thanksgiving Day and the Friday after** Please note that the only Mass on Thanksgiving Day is at 9 a.m. at Nauvoo. There will be no Masses on the Friday after Thanksgiving.

Masses for Christmas You figured there would have to be changes. Here's what we're doing this year. Christmas Eve: 4:00 p.m. Mass at SSPN. 7 p.m. Mass at ICC. 10 p.m. Mass at SHDC. Christmas Day: 8 a.m. Mass, SHW. 10 a.m. Mass, SMH. Each subsequent year, our churches will move to the next Mass time; for example, in 2023, Christmas Eve: 4 p.m. Mass at ICC. 7 p.m. Mass at SHDC. 10 p.m. Mass at SHW. Christmas Day: 8 a.m. Mass, SMH. 10 a.m. Mass, SSPN. And so the cycle continues, every year. Keep in mind two things: first, Fr. Tony's own health and stamina; second, each church will have the opportunity to benefit from the more favorably scheduled Masses.

**Masses for the Immaculate Conception** Wednesday, December 7: 5:30 p.m. at SHDC. 7:00 p.m. at ICC. Thursday, December 8: 8:30 a.m., SPPN (SPPS children). 5:30 p.m., SHW. 7:00 p.m., SMH. A rotation of churches for more favorably scheduled Masses will be more difficult here, because we want SPPS to know that Mass on Holy Days is a part of the life of the school.

Diocesan Adoration Schedule A specially designed and crafted Monstrance to symbolize our unity in devotion to the mystery of the Eucharist is being borne from church to church throughout the diocese. Three of our churches are involved very soon; the other two, later in 2023. Here's what the schedule looks like. On Thursday evening, December 1, ICC will host a Holy Hour of Adoration of the Holy Eucharist from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m., and from 3 to 4 p.m. before the Saturday evening Mass at ICC on December 3. The Monstrance then moves to SHW for a period of Adoration from 7 to 8 a.m., just before the Sunday morning Mass at SHW on December 4. Another Adoration period takes place Monday, December 5, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Next in line is SHDC, where Adoration will take place from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 7, just before the evening Mass; and then on December 8, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. And the Monstrance is borne to Raritan, from that point on.

Mass in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe will be Monday evening, December 12, 5:30 p.m. at ICC, with dinner to follow in the parish hall.

**Blessed Art, December 3 and 4** Your support and solidarity with Palestinian Christians is deeply appreciated by Blessed Art; and for our purchases, we receive absolutely beautiful religious articles. **Thermostat notice** We expect that the already steep increase in energy prices will spike upwards even more significantly once we enter 2023. Therefore, when our churches and our other buildings are not in use, the thermostats will be turned down to 55 degrees; when Masses and other events are taking place, the thermostats will be set at 65 degrees. Be advised: we are indeed very sensitive to your need for comfort and protection from the cold; but we don't want to waste the money you so generously give to your churches. And we'll be using even more of it for energy costs. So however you have to bundle up to be comfortable -warm! - by all means, do so!


