

"On The Q/T..."

From A Simple Path, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, by Lucinda Varney: "The hallmark of a true follower of mine is joy. Not a surface pleasure at life's happenings, but a welling up from within of that happiness that can only come from a heart at peace, secure in its friendship with me. Joy, strong and calm, is what attracts people to me. How many who claim me as Lord, reflect a dull Christ, and wonder that the world turns rather to the glitter and tinsel of that world's pleasures. Truly my followers deny me in so doing My followers too often point to the grave-clothes of the tomb."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

Be careful, here. Don't box Jesus in. Sometimes we're called upon to reflect the sorrowful Christ, the suffering Christ, even the righteously angry Christ. Like those people who come into our churches and wonder why we have Christ on the crucifix when he isn't there anymore: be careful. We have crucifixes because St. Paul says, "We preach Christ Jesus, and Him crucified." And we have Sacred Heart statues to illustrate, that Jesus has a heartfelt love for us. Don't box Jesus in. Now, given all that, how about this for a question: "How about that joy, coming as it should from a deep friendship with Jesus; just where is my friendship with Jesus?"
