Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

NOVEMBER 6, 2022

2 Maccabees 7:1-2,9-14;
2 Thessalonians 2:16—3:5;
Luke 20:27-38

There are several books of Maccabees; two of these are accepted by Catholics as inspired and belonging to the Bible. Protestants and Jews do not accept these books. The books treat of a horrible time for the Jews.

The Syrian King Antiochus Epiphanes IV forbade the practice of Judaism. He forbade circumcision, forbade the practice of the kosher laws, and desecrated the Temple at Jerusalem by placing a statue of Zeus in it. He ordered Jews to sacrifice to pagan deities. He was not a nice man.

Today's first reading tells of the heroic sons who died rather than give up their faith. The "rest of the story" is that there were seven brothers: The last was offered riches if he would give up his faith. His mother did not want to see him die, but she urged him to be faithful to God rather than give in to paganism. He also died.

The second reading, from 2 Thessalonians, urges us to keep the faith, and to pray for the strength to withstand the temptations of this world and of the devil.

The Gospel tells of a dilemma posed to Jesus by the Sadducees. This group of Jews were really agnostics; they did not believe in life after death. (Our late beloved Bishop Mark Carroll used to say, "The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection of the dead; that was the reason they were sad, you see!")

We don't know what heaven will be like. But we know that we shall enjoy the blessedness of God himself for all eternity. That is worth sacrificing for. Today's Mass challenges us to sacrifice present pleasures for future happiness. Let us be steadfastly loyal to the Lord, even to the point of death. Glory awaits those who persevere.

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 6, 2022

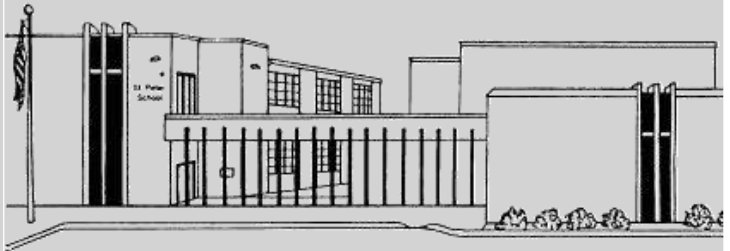
Dear Parishioners,

On this first weekend in our month of November, the Church celebrates the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary time. As we look ahead, we realize that our liturgical year is coming to a close. In fact, there are only 34 weeks in this time called “ordinary” and we will celebrate its conclusion on the Solemnity of Christ the King, November 20. As we bring this year to a close, let's pray that God's grace will fill our hearts and lives and help us be the stewards He calls us to be.

This weekend I get the privilege of speaking at all the Masses. We are bringing to a conclusion our Stewardship Renewal weekend. Each of you has received in the mail Stewardship Renewal packets. In these packets you will find our ministry catalogue, along with a letter from me as well as a Stewardship Commitment card. What I ask you this year, as I have in all the other previous years, is to take these commitment cards to prayer. The reason we have you fill these forms out each year is that our situations often change, as does God's call to each of us in forms of prayer, in forms of ministry, and in forms of treasures. I really encourage you to take these forms to prayer where you can discern what God is asking each of you for this stewardship year. We might think that what I think I can do is okay, and I suppose it is. But it becomes much more rewarding when we discern the commitment to which God is calling us this year. So please, before you fill out the forms, take it to prayer. When we do that then we are fulfilling God's will in our gift rather than thinking we can do this by ourselves. Stewardship is realizing all that God has done for us, and in turn we give back to Him from our time, talents, and treasures. So above all, please, please take it to prayer. Then fill out the forms and return them to us in the collection, through the mail, or bring them by the rectory. If anyone has misplaced their commitment cards, there will be extra's in the narthex. We need your assistance as we strive to become a stewardship parish.

This weekend at our 5:00 p.m. Mass, we will have our Mass of Remembrance. This is always special as we remember all those parishioners who have died this past year. We also have near the baptismal font our Book of the Dead with all those names of these parishioners inscribed in them. The Church celebrates this month what is called the Communion of Saints. We celebrate the Church in heaven, called the Church triumphant. We celebrate each of us, the Church on earth, in what is called the Church militant. And finally, we celebrate the Church suffering, those purging themselves, preparing for their new life in heaven with the Church triumphant. This last grouping is whom we remember in our Masses and prayers as they make ready to purge themselves of any flaws, imperfections, and after-effects of sin as they make ready to enjoy the fullness of God's life in heaven. As we so often pray, as in the case today, *May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace now and forever. Amen.* Again, please remember all those who have died. Our prayers never go unanswered as Our Lord hears our prayers and grants eternal rest to all those who are in need of our prayers. As the Living Church here on earth, we have a responsibility and an obligation to remember those who have gone before us in death.

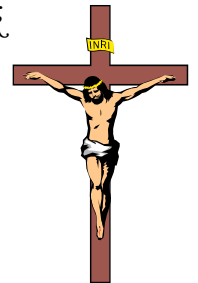
