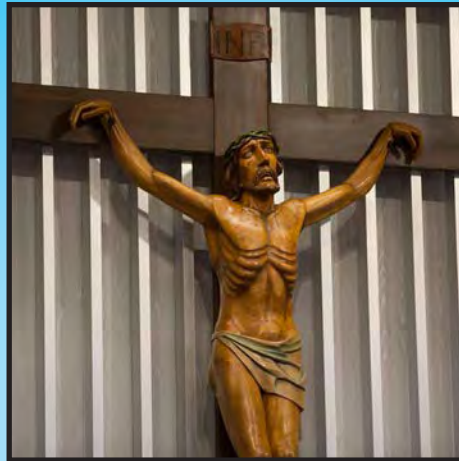

1 Confirmation and First Holy Communion were celebrated with Bishop Paprocki at the Cathedral of the Immaculate

Conception for the first time. This is an initiative on part of the bishop to recognize these celebrations as opportunities for our young people to recognize their membership in the larger diocesan and universal Church and to come and see the Cathedral. In recent years, the Confirmation and First Communion ages have been reset to the third grade, recognizing that our young people are in need of God's grace in Confirmation at an earlier age, also matching an instruction that conferral of this sacrament is to take place at the 'age of reason'. As a result, the sacraments are also returned to their proper order, Baptism → Confirmation → Eucharist, as observed nearly universally until the 20th century.

celebrations were particularly successful this year, thanks to good weather and a greater return to 'normal' after the COVID. We thank our chair-people and volunteers and all who worked so hard to bring about these cherished parish social events. 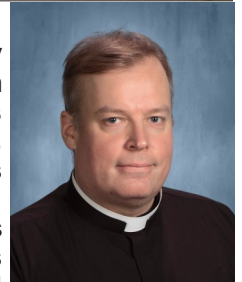
to come and join us, to share in the adventure of the Catholic Faith!

During Holy Week, **Fr. Tom celebrated his 50th birthday.**

A small gathering was held on Palm Sunday, where Fr. Tom's parents and his brothers and sister and their families came out to share some cake and make old-age jokes. The students of St. Dominic School also made cards and had a celebration after Wednesday Mass on April 13, which featured a birthday-balloon decorated old-age wheel-chair for the guest of honor.

Bishop Paprocki came to St. Anthony for a **pastoral visit** in May. He celebrated and preached the weekend Masses, highlighting his hopes for stewardship as a focus in



parish life. Afterwards, bishop met with the pastoral and finance councils at a luncheon held at St. Dominic school, where he answered questions and visited with parishioners. Bishop plans to visit all 120+ parishes in the diocese in the

next five years.

6 Fr. Tom went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in August, with Fr. Tom Meyer, Deacon Harry and Cindy Cramer, and a number of St. Anthony, Blessed Sacrament, and other Quincy-area parishioners. The group traced the footsteps of Jesus in his early ministry in Nazareth and on the Sea of Galilee, before going to Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and Jericho. The outstanding hospitality of the Palestinian Christians was most memorable, providing a living witness to the history, events, and people of the region, whom we otherwise might only know from books and stories in the international news.

7 In April, the Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools Leadership Team hosted a series of listening sessions in each of the Quincy parishes, highlighting the work of this team, consisting of representatives from each parish school board and finance council, along with principals and pastors of each parish and leadership from Quincy Notre Dame (QND) High School. In an effort to preserve and advance Catholic Education in the 21st century, the team is proposing a unified governance structure for the Quincy Catholic Schools. Implementation of this new structure is expected to promote efficient sharing and deployment of resources in all of our schools and provide a governance structure for further long-term planning and goals for Catholic Education in Quincy.



8 Students at St. Dominic School have been studying the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, as part of observing and recognizing "Holy Moments" in their everyday lives. Each morning at the St. Dominic morning meeting, one of the classes takes a turn in teaching about one of the Works of Mercy. Later, the same class comes to St. Anthony for Mass on a Saturday night to celebrate what they have learned, tell the parish about their experience with "Holy Moments", and have a pizza dinner party.

9 St. Dominic 8th graders of the Class of 2022 and the Class of 2023 each took class trips to Washington, DC during 2022. A long-time tradition established by Fr. Roy Bauer at St. Peter's, students are invited to learn about many of the major historical sites and attractions in and around our nation's capital. The trip



also has the effect of helping our students recognize their role as citizens contributing to the good of society and government. The bus trip was long and arduous. Students walk miles and miles over the week. It was a first time on a long trip away from home and family for many of them. Thus, it was a most memorable experience. Thank you to all of our parishioners who have organized fundraising activities to help our students and their families to afford the trip. A special thanks especially goes out to our eighth grade teacher, Hope Glidewell as well as Dave Cawthon from St. Peter's who lead the trip for our students.

10 Finally, during 2022 St. Anthony completed a project to rework the parking lot south of the church and in front of the parish hall. Funding for this project was generously provided by the estate of Kent Wellman, who specified in his will the desire that the parish undertake this project. We thank him and his family for this substantial gift, which was greatly needed. Kent, himself, was quite active in the Holy Name Men's Society, which oversaw elements of this project and its members provided a variety of gifts in time, talent, and treasure to see the project through to completion.



Once again, thanks to all who have made 2022 a joyous and blessed year. May the Lord continue to shower us with his blessings in 2023. Blessed Christmas and Happy New Year!

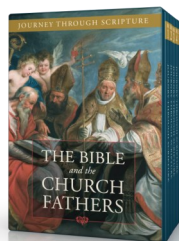

The Bible and the Church Fathers

Starting in February



The scripture study class this winter will be on "The Bible and the Church Fathers". While many Christians know scripture, many are unclear as to how the Scripture was received in the early Church, bringing enlightenment to Sacred Tradition and the Sacraments we reverence today. Lessons include an introduction to the "Patristic Era" of the Church, the biblical of what it means to be a "church", and the role of the Sacraments, old and new covenants, and "mystagogy" in the life of the Church. Along the way we will meet the apostles, Clement, Polycarp, Justin Martyr, John Chrysostom, Augustine, and other heroes of the age. This 12-part video course is tentatively scheduled to begin on Wednesday, February 1 in the parish hall.

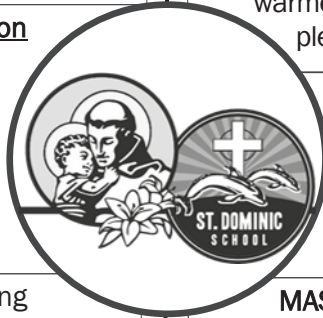

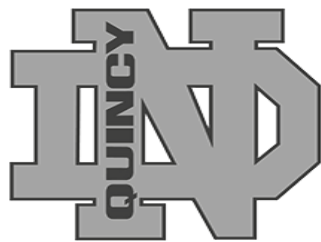
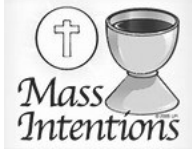
