

"On The Q/T..."

From A Simple Path: Mother Teresa of Calcutta, by Lucinda Varney. (From Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman): "Dear Lord, help me to spread thy fragrance everywhere I go. Flood my soul with Thy spirit and life. Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly that all my life may only be a radiance of Thine. Shine through me, and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with may feel Thy presence in my soul. Let them look up and see no longer me, but only Thee, O Lord. Stay with me, and then I shall begin to shine as Thou shinest; so to shine as to be a light to others. The light O Lord will be all from Thee; none of it will be mine. It will be Thou, shining on others through me. Let me thus praise Thee in the way Thou doest love best, by shining on those around me. Let me preach Thee without preaching, not by words but by example, by the catching force, the sympathetic influence of what I do, the evident fullness of the love my heart bears to Thee."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

This week is the immediate preparation for Christmas: spiritually. If you haven't met Jesus in the encounter with forgiveness in the sacrament of Confession - the sacrament of Penance - I ask you to consider the above prayer as an examination of conscience. Look at the completely different orientation of life it proposes. That you haven't even seen your life that way...or lost touch with your life when you used to see it that way: wouldn't that be enough of an eye opener for you to take advantage of the opportunity Jesus gives us, and enter into the sacrament of Confession?

Masses for Christmas You figured there would have to be changes. Here's what we're doing this year December 24-25, 2022.

Christmas Eve: Nauvoo-4:00 p.m. Carthage-7:00 p.m. Dallas City-10:00 p.m.

Christmas Day: Warsaw-8:00 a.m. Hamilton-10:00 a.m.

Each subsequent year, our churches will move to the next Mass time; for example, in 2023, Christmas Eve: 4 p.m. Mass at ICC. 7 p.m. Mass at SHDC. 10 p.m. Mass at SHW. Christmas Day: 8 a.m. Mass, SMH. 10 a.m. Mass, SSPN. And so the cycle continues, every year. Keep in mind two things: first, Fr. Tony's own health and stamina; second, each church will have the opportunity to benefit from the more favorably scheduled Masses.

From "Growing Disciples" We are all called to evangelize - to announce and "talk" about Jesus, by word and example. But in order to evangelize, we need to first fully experience who Jesus is in ourselves. This means understanding the truth: Jesus, who He is. It also means discovering our role in His Kingdom, and meeting Him - being able to know that we've actually crossed paths with Him! - in our lives. Our hearts must be converted, daily."

It isn't enough to be in the same building for Mass. Where language is a problem, a handshake, a smile, some time to struggle with what both parties mean when they're trying to communicate with each other: these efforts endear people to each other, if people allow it. We have Spanish speaking Catholics here; and we have Swahili speaking Catholics here. See yourself as someone who can bridge the distance, extend the friendship, make it a point not to leave someone new to you a stranger. Take it from me, Fr. Tony. There's hardly a thing I do that somebody else can't do better - but nobody can jump into the middle of the lake and flail away swimming better than I can! See the point? Get over the jitters - and any biases you might have - and "jump in!" I know these people well enough to know that they aren't a part of the turmoil going on in our country. And please eliminate one worry if you have it: that I'll spend more time with them I will with you. A priest is a priest for everybody. Fr. T.


