Dear Parishioners,

In the beautiful responsorial psalm for the evening Mass on Christmas eve, we sing the words, "Today is born our Savior, Christ the Lord." These words proclaim the Solemnity for which we have been preparing, and the hope fulfilled for all humanity. Yes, "Today is born our Savior, Christ the Lord." This long awaited Messiah, the Word of God, becomes flesh, and our world is transformed, not through our making, but rather through the Will of the God who never gave up on His creation. And because of that, we gather this evening and morning as a very thankful people. In spite of the failures and fall of humanity, God, through Jesus, has once again reconciled us to Him and showed us in concrete form God's very love for all of us.

I always like to use the gospel of St. Luke, the one used at night on Christmas eve, in our celebration of Christmas. It places the birth of Jesus in historical context, when Caesar Augustus was the emperor and Quirinius was governor of Syria. In accord with the decree, there was to be a census, and each family was to be enrolled in their home town. And so we find Joseph and Mary returning to Bethlehem because Joseph was of the house of David. Let the words penetrate our hearts: "While they were there, the time came for her to have her child and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn." Simple explanation for a profound mystery. And now we find witnesses of this event, people who represented the Jewish tradition. Our proclamation "Now there were shepherds in that region living it the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. And the angels said to them, "Do not be afraid for behold, I proclaim to you the good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a Savior has been born for you who is Christ the Lord." And in response to this declaration, the angels proclaimed what should be our response to such great a mystery, "Glory to God in the highest; and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests." On behalf of St. Peter priests, staff, and school personnel, I want to wish each and every one of you a very BLESSED AND MERRY CHRISTMAS. Let the words of this gospel echo in your hearts and lives as we rejoice in the Lord's coming among us in history, as well as His coming to us in mystery especially through the Sacraments.

As I reflect upon my memories of Christmas' past, I am forever grateful to my mother and father who taught me what Christmas is all about. It is about family, it is about faith, and it is about Eucharist. I remember getting up early as kids on Christmas morning, full of excitement and eagerness to open up our presents. But the most cherished memory was when we went to Church as a family, celebrating the Eucharist when we would hear Christ coming in our history and then celebrate His coming in mystery and through the Eucharist that was present. As I reflect on that memory, I still miss my parents. They taught me a lot about giving, about sharing; and I thank God for these memories imprinted in my life. I pray that they are enjoying the fullness of Christmas in their lives with Christ.
