

Masses for Christmas You figured there would have to be changes. Here's what we're doing this year December 24-25, 2022.

Christmas Eve: Nauvoo- 4:00 p.m. Carthage-7:00 p.m. Dallas City-10:00 p.m.

Christmas Day: Warsaw-8:00 a.m. Hamilton-10:00 a.m.

Each subsequent year, our churches will move to the next Mass time; for example, in 2023, Christmas Eve: 4 p.m. Mass at ICC. 7 p.m. Mass at SHDC. 10 p.m. Mass at SHW. Christmas Day: 8 a.m. Mass, SMH. 10 a.m. Mass, SSPN. And so the cycle continues, every year. Keep in mind two things: first, Fr. Tony's own health and stamina; second, each church will have the opportunity to benefit from the more favorably scheduled Masses.

Christmas Decorations, All Churches We leave it up to our respective decoration volunteers, if the following suggestion doesn't work out. But how about everybody at the same time knowing that our churches can set up Christmas decorations after their scheduled Masses on December 17 and 18? How about that, everybody?!!


