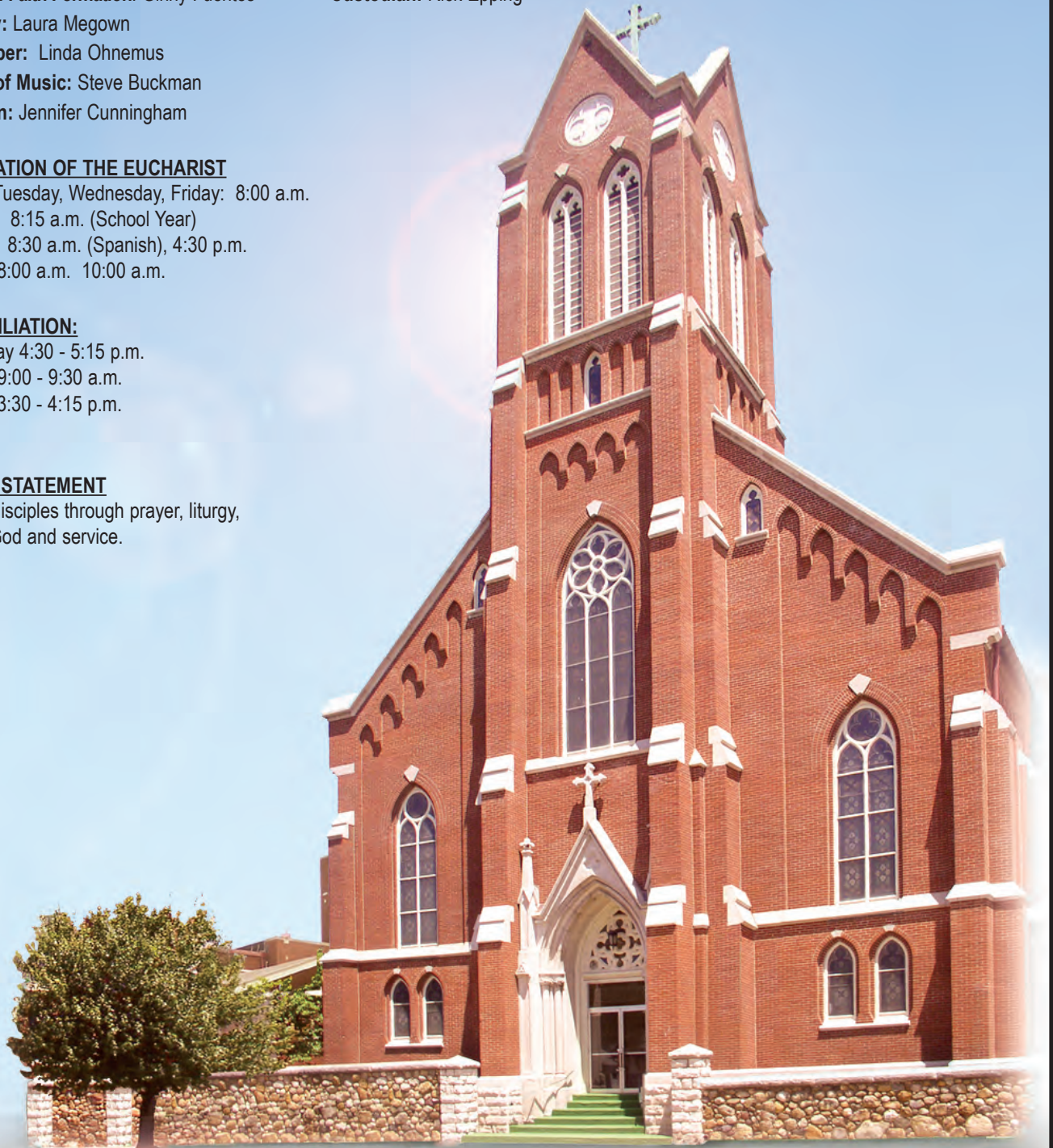

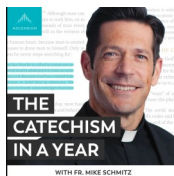
What is a Catechism?

With studies of the "Catechism in a Year" up and running, you might ask yourself, "What is a catechism and what do I use it for?" The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* began as a recommendation from the Extraordinary Synod of Bishops in 1985. In 1986, Pope St. John Paul II appointed a Commission of Cardinals and Bishops to develop a compendium of Catholic doctrine. This means that a Catechism is simply a written down collection of all of the official teachings of the Catholic Church. On December 8, 1992 Pope John Paul II promulgated the Catechism with an apostolic constitution.

The Catechism was written and intended for the use of Bishops who are the teachers and guardians of the rule of faith, but it was Pope St. John Paul II's great hope that the laity would use and greatly benefit from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. St. John Paul II said that the Catechism, "is offered to all the faithful who want to understand better the inexhaustible riches of salvation."

The Catechism is more than an encyclopedic collection of all Catholic teaching and intellectual information. The Catechism is also beautiful and full of quotes from the Popes, Saints, and mystics of our Catholic tradition. The Catechism invites the faithful to a deeper transformation of mind and heart. A variety of people would benefit from the reading of the Catechism as it has been adapted not only for the laity, but even Youth Editions of the Catechism have been created and promulgated such as the YouCat.
