# Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**JANUARY 29, 2023** 

Zephaniah 2:3,3:12-13; 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 5:1-12a

Matthew's Gospel is the most "Jewish" of the Gospels. It is structured around five great sermons or discourses of Jesus. The reason: There were five scrolls or books of Moses; Matthew shows Jesus as the "new Moses." The first of the sermons is the Sermon on the Mount. Moses went up on the mountain to receive the Holy Torah; Jesus goes up the mountain to proclaim the "new Law."

If we add the infancy story of Jesus and the Passion-Death-Resurrection narrative to the five sermons, we have *seven* units. The perfect number to the Jews was seven! These are but a few examples of the "Jewishness" of Matthew. Matthew wants to show Jesus as the fulfillment of all the promises made to the Jews.

Today's Gospel contain the opening words of the very first sermon recorded of Jesus, the Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes can be considered in many different ways. They may be an entirely new "value system": Jesus blesses humility; the world blesses pride. Jesus blesses the meek; the world extols the self-assertive. Jesus blesses those who are sorry for sin ("mourn"); the world never wants to admit a mistake. Jesus blesses the clean of heart; the world cherishes the risque, the bawdy, and the immoral.

The Beatitudes might also be considered as the process of conversion: "Poor in spirit" means those who have nothing else to rely on; they must turn to God. Unless we realize our need for God, we won't turn to him. "Sorrowing" really means those who are sorry for sin. We must realize our sinfulness and want to turn away. We must hunger and thirst for holiness in order that the Lord may fill us with his saving grace. Then, in turn, if we show mercy to others, God will show us mercy.

The first reading, from Zephaniah, urges us to seek humility and justice. The second reading tells us that we aren't too sophisticated or wise; but no matter! God chooses those who are nothing to show his own powerful grace. Realize your need of God, your need to reform; hunger for holiness. The Lord will fill you.

# The Parish of St. Peter Quincy, IL

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 29, 2023

### Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday in our Ordinary time. This weekend, I want to concentrate on the second reading for our Scriptures, a reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians. This reading for me always gives me a sense of hope. When one thinks of all the people that Jesus could have called to be the first disciples, he chooses the most unlikely people, fishermen, tax collectors, zealots, and others who would not have qualified for much in terms of education, religious involvement, or any other high honors given to people of this age. And we might ask why them? Our answer is found in that second reading which Paul states: "Consider your own calling. Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were of noble birth. Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God." Paul gives us the answer why Jesus chose the apostles, and why Jesus chooses each of us. The answer is found, not in our accomplishments, but in our openness so that in spite of our humanness, in spite of our sinfulness, and in spite of our unworthiness, He is able to work in and through us so to bring His message to the world. And so if we recognize our value to Him, then we will grasp Paul's conclusion as he states, "whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord." Whatever we have and whatever we accomplish, it is the Lord's work in and through each of us. The apostles learned it, so must we.

This weekend we also begin what we call Catholic School's Week here in the United States. One of the gifts that our ancestors provided for us was the gift of evangelization through a very strong Catholic school system. It was always the intention of parishioners of the past to have a Catholic school to preserve, nurture, and strengthen the Catholic faith in our young people. And for all these years, there were sacrifices made by parishioners to make this intention a reality for each generation of young people. Needless to say, our Catholic schools are not free, nor are our parents the main supporters. Instead the Catholic school of any parish is a commitment of time, treasure, and talents of so many people to maintain and help grow a school that provides quality Catholic education. This is what St. Peter parishioners have done and will continue to do so that our Catholic faith will be passed down to each generation of young people. We have what we have because our parents and parishioners support and invest in this quality Catholic education. As we celebrate who we are as a Catholic school, I thank all of you for your commitment to this mission of our parish family. We are more than a private school, we are more than a Christian school, we are a school that is Catholic, a school that teaches and lives by our Catholic faith. May we always see this school in light of the faith that we live and the morals we have. Are we perfect? No, but we are forgiven and always provide that hope for people of every age.

Please consult the bulletin for various activities this week as St. Peter School celebrates Catholic School's Week. In a special way, I want to thank our administrators, teachers, and staff along with all personnel for their ministry of love as they work with our students and parents. God bless all of you!




