From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. Today we celebrate the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. The Magi represent the Gentiles to whom our Lord intended to include in his gift of salvation. The Gentiles were not the original Chosen People, but our Lord always intended to include them in his plan of salvation. In God's plan Israel was to be like the Star of Bethlehem - a light to the nations to guide them to the Lord. Like Israel, the Church today is called to be the star to guide people today on their path to the Lord.

Tomorrow (Monday) we celebrate the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. Tomorrow we celebrate the manifestation of Jesus during his baptism in the Jordan River. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation, yet we are all encouraged to attend and recall our own Baptism. Tomorrow's Solemnity officially Closes out the Christmas Season. This Tuesday we return to the season of Ordinary Time. We will march through the season of Ordinary Time for the next 6 ½ weeks until Ash Wednesday, which falls this year on Wed. Feb. 22.

This month we begin collecting subscription money for our Diocesan Newspaper, the Catholic Times. I encourage our parishioners to include \$15.00 in your Catholic Times envelope for your annual CT subscription. You may return your envelope in the collection anytime in the next few weeks.

Our Accounting Office is making available Printed copies of your annual 2022 Financial contribution statements for you to pick up in church. In the upcoming weeks we will have labeled and sealed envelopes containing your contribution information that you can use in preparing your tax return. Envelopes will be sorted alphabetically, and we encourage you to pick up your sealed envelope before or after Mass.

Finally, I will soon begin Server Training with our 4th Grade students and any other interested students in Grades 5-8. This training usually takes 4 -5 weeks to complete. We hope to have a New Server Commissioning on Sun. Feb. 19 at the 10:00 a.m. Mass.

Spiritual Resolutions: Catechism in a Year *Ginny Fuentes*

I perpetually fail at New Year's resolutions. In fact, I don't even set them most years. Whether you love them or hate them resolutions are a way to grow and virtue and live life intentionally. It is an invitation to not just life happen to us, but rather to be full participants in this great gift of the Lord.

The negative side of resolutions is their ability to turn us inward rather than outward. While this in itself is not bad, it is great to set resolutions that help our relationships and in particular our relationship with God.

This year my New Year's resolution is spiritual. Along with my husband, I hope to complete Father Mike Schmitz's Catechism in a Year Podcast. I tried and failed at Bible in a Year (maybe this would be a good resolution for 2024.), but I am looking forward to growing not only in knowledge of the Church and her teachings, but also to experience a deeper transformation of my heart. In one of the prelaunch episodes with Bishop Andrew Cozzens, Bishop of Crookston Minnesota, Father Mike and Bishop Cozzens point out that we cannot love what we do not know. It makes sense to conclude that greater knowledge of someone has ability to lead to deeper love of that person. My hope is that in learning about the four pillars of the Catechism that me and my family will grow in deeper friendship with Christ. The four parts are as follows:

- 1. What We Believe
- 2. How We Worship
- 3. How We Live
- 4. How We Pray



Saint Apollinaris the Apologist January 8th Feast Day

St. Apollinaris was one of the first great martyrs of the church. He was made Bishop of Ravenna by St. Peter. The miracles he conducted in Ravenna soon attracted official attention, for they and his preaching won many converts to the faith. However, at the same time, his words and works brought upon the fury of the pagan people who beat Apollinaris cruelly on several occasions.

During one beating, Apollinaris was cut with knives, and scalding hot water poured over his wounds, then put on a ship to be sent to Greece.

In Greece the same course of preachings, and miracles, and sufferings continued. In fact, after a cruel beating by Greek pagans, he was sent back to Italy.

When Emperor Vespasian issued a decree of banishment against the Christians, Apollinaris was kept hidden for some time, but as he was leaving, passing through the gates of the city, he was attacked and savagely beaten. He lived for seven days, foretell-
