

From *God Calling*, A.J. Russell ed. *Meditation for January 2*. "You are to help to save others. **From "Growing Disciples": About Evangelization** It can be easy to fall into ignorance or apathy, and see God the way that the rest of the world does. But if we allow Jesus into our hearts, get to know Jesus as a person and encounter him in our lives, we are set free from what the world says, and our lives are truly free.
