Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

JANUARY 8, 2023

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6;
Matthew 2:1-12

The word “epiphany” means “manifestation” or “glorious appearance.” Originally, the word referred to the big showy event when a monarch visited his provinces. There were parties and banquets and parades; there was a general amnesty for prisoners; everyone enjoyed the “epiphany” of the prince.

The word came to be used in a theological and liturgical sense: It refers to the glorious appearance of Jesus Christ as King and Savior of the entire world. He is not merely the *Messiah* of the Jews; he is Lord of all peoples and nations and places. Epiphany is, thus, the original feast of Christ the King. Epiphany is a kind of *Mission Sunday*.

All of the texts of today’s Mass teach urgent will of God to include the non-Jews (the Gentiles) in God’s saving plan. The Magi or Wise Men (*not* astrologers!) represent all the nations of the world: They were not of the “Chosen,” but they came from afar to do homage to Jesus. The Gospel emphasizes the irony that these people who had been in darkness work hard to find the light; meanwhile the people who should have seen the light preferred darkness.

The first reading speaks of people coming from “afar” to bring gifts to the Lord. “Afar” means that they were not worshipers of the one God. The second reading is Paul’s marvel at the mystery of God’s plan: He now intends to include non-Jews (Gentiles) in salvation.

In the western Church, Epiphany was associated with three events: the coming of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. Nowadays, we separate these three events. But each of them is a manifestation of the glory of Jesus Christ.

We need to examine our consciences: God intends all persons to come to the knowledge of the truth and be saved. But they cannot do this unless we reach out to them. Each of us is called to be a witness of Christ to our neighborhood, our community, and to the world. If we do nothing, the world will continue to sink, and the Church will continue to lose ground. Let us pray that we may have zeal for the missions at home and abroad.

The Epiphany of the Lord Solemnity, January 8, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

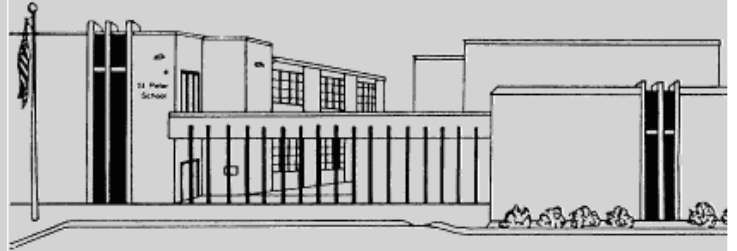
Perhaps the best summary of our celebration today is found in our responsorial psalm that states: “Lord every nation on earth will adore you.” On Christmas day, the shepherds, representatives of the Jewish world, came to adore the newborn king. Today’s Feast, the Solemnity of the Epiphany, has the magi coming from the east to worship the newborn king. The magi are the representatives of the Gentile world. So with our Christmas celebration and now the Epiphany, the words of the responsorial psalm are fulfilled, as we say, “Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.”

For those who are interested in Catholic trivia, these wise men, or magi, from the East, come to worship this newborn king, bringing with them three gifts. This gospel narration from Matthew gives rise to the tradition that there were three in number. Because Venerable Bede (672-735) considered them representatives of the three continents of Europe, Asia, and Africa, we often seem them racially as white, yellow, and black. About them he gives the names as Melchior, Gaspar, and Balthasar, Melchior was a long-bearded, white-haired old man who brought gold to Jesus, signifying His royalty. Gaspar was a beardless, ruddy-complexioned young man who brought incense to Jesus, signifying His divinity. And Balthasar was a heavy-bearded black man who brought myrrh to Jesus, signifying his humanity and death. As you look at our statues this weekend, take a close look to see how well they resemble these magi pictured by Venerable Bede.

Within the last month, I have been discussing the possibility of doing some capital improvements here at St. Peter Church. We are faced with a number of issues from security to the need for more classrooms. We also need meeting room space for all the various activities that seem to center themselves here at St. Peter. After consultation with the Finance Council, as well as other groups of parishioners, it was decided to pursue these capital improvements. So our tentative plans are to build a building where the old Tolton Hall was, the old convent. This building would have a new cafeteria, with classrooms above it. This would free our current cafeteria to be used by the parish as a parish center. We could now have our funeral dinners in this new space, along with opening up several classrooms to fill the void of meeting spaces. With that being said, our security at our grade school would be much better, not having to leave our doors open for visitors to these dinners, as well as our young people having to go outside in order to eat lunch in the old cafeteria. I have tried my best to be frugal pastor and I know that this parish has done their best to be great stewards. In light of that, there is a need to make some improvements for the parishioners. The last capital improvement was the Living Stones project that occurred before my time as your pastor and I have been here 11 years. So I am planting the seed and will keep you in touch as we try to make some necessary improvements to our campus.

I ask your prayers for Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. After serving the Church for 95 years, the Church celebrated his funeral Mass last Thursday and then he was buried in the grotto of St. Peter’s Basilica. Our prayers are for him. We are thankful to God for his many years of service to the Church. May the angels of God lead him to heaven. May he rest in peace.

Haiti Sister Parish Update

During the Christmas season Father Michel communicated via Whatsapp to thank Monsignor Leo and the parishioners of St. Peter Parish for our continued financial support and prayers. As we reported, 2022 was the most challenging and difficult time since the inception of our sister parish relationship in 2015. Food insecurity, inflation, and unrest were constant in the daily lives of Haitians. Lawlessness in Port-au-Prince prevented our yearly Twinning shipment from being sent. In early spring we were notified by the Parish Twinning Program of the Americas that they would not sponsor a shipment in May. Port employees were being harassed and it was too dangerous for priests to pick up the contents of the containers. Unless the situation changes dramatically, there will be no shipment in 2023.

Father Michel's goal for 2023 will continue to be to feed his people. With your generous support, he will be able to achieve that goal. Thank you in advance.
