

"On The Q/T..."

From *God Calling, A.J. Russell, ed. Reflection of February 22nd.* "You must trust me wholly. This lesson has to be learned. You shall be helped, you shall be led, you shall be guided, continually. The children of Israel would long before have entered the Promised Land; only their doubts and fears continually drove them back into the wilderness. Remember always: doubts delay. Are you trusting in me, or not? I have told you how to live. You must do it. My children, I love you. Trust my tender love. It will never fail you - but you must learn not to fail it."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

The Lenten season begins on Wednesday. Our five Masses throughout the day, as well as our pastoral care visits, include the blessing and bestowal of ashes to indicate our solidarity with the Church throughout the world in her following the path of Jesus from his Baptism in the Jordan River and Temptations in the Desert, to the mystery of His Triumph of the Cross and the Resurrection. Jeff Cavins, the author of Journey Through the Bible, brought his Quick Journey version to a climax when he said that the Cross and the Resurrection were Jesus' way of saying to us, "See? You can trust me! Didn't I tell you? You can trust me!" So, how's this for a question: Without making an obstacle course out of Lent (all those plans that fizzle out by the third week of Lent - don't do that!): How can you direct your deepening prayer, willing midst of all that is swirling within and around you?

The Catholic Church's Observance of the Season of Lent. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious, and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

1. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, 2023 and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, and Good Friday, April 15,

2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, and Good Friday, April 15, 2023.

3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

Ash Wednesday, February 22. We want you to be aware of the way we'll begin the season of Lent as soon as possible. All occasions for the distribution and reception of penitential ashes on Wednesday will be in the context of the Sacrifice of the Mass. We're aware of time constraints!
