Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

FEBRUARY 19, 2023

Leviticus 19:1-2,17-18; 1 Corinthians 3:16-23;
Matthew 5:38-48

Sometimes we tend to think of the God of the Old Testament as the God of wrath, and the God of the New Testament as the God of love. We sometimes imagine that the Old Testament emphasized law, while the New Testament is concerned with love.

But God is the same God, whether in the Old or the New Testament. Today's first reading, from Leviticus, is from the "Holiness Code." The motive for which we should do all things is because God himself is holy, and he expects us to be holy. Our reading omits many verses, but it sums them up in the one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

The second reading gives us another motive for holiness: We are the temple of God; the Holy Spirit lives in us. We should never disgrace that Spirit within us. When we come into church, we observe reverence and awe for the presence of God. We should have the same reverence for God who lives within us. Let us always live in God's presence.

The Gospel continues the Sermon on the Mount. The Old Law did not mean that we should take vengeance on our neighbor. "An eye for an eye" was really merciful: It means, "If someone does damage to you, you may not do any more damage to him than has been done to you." So if he hits you in the eye, you cannot mug him; you can only inflict the same damage.

But even the Old Law went beyond this. Jesus goes far beyond, in commanding us to love our enemies, to do good to those who hate us, and to pray for those who persecute us. If we only love our friends, there is no merit in that. We prove that we are Christians by showing our loving care for all persons.

The Christian moral code is tough. It demands more of us than what we "feel" by nature. Let us always strive to be holy, for the Lord is holy. Let us remember to show reverence for everyone, for we are the temples of the Spirit. And let us pray that we may live up to the moral code of Jesus and not that of this world.

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 19, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is the last celebration of Ordinary Time until the Solemnity of Pentecost, May 28. Then we return to Ordinary Time after celebrating both the seasons of Lent and Easter. But today we celebrate the 7th Sunday in this Ordinary Time. Perhaps we can, as we prepare for the season of Lent beginning this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday, look into our lives with the words of St. Paul in our first reading. Speaking to the Corinthians and each of us, Paul reminds us with a question, “do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you.” Perhaps if we remember that we are the temple of God, it might help us in our season of Lent to make sure that as temples God has His rightful place in our lives.

This Wednesday, February 22, is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of our Season of Lent. Our Mass schedule for that day will be as follows:

8:30 a.m. Mass, St. Peter Church 12:10 p.m. Mass, St. Peter Church
10:00 a.m. Mass, QND gym 6:30 p.m. Mass, St. Peter Church

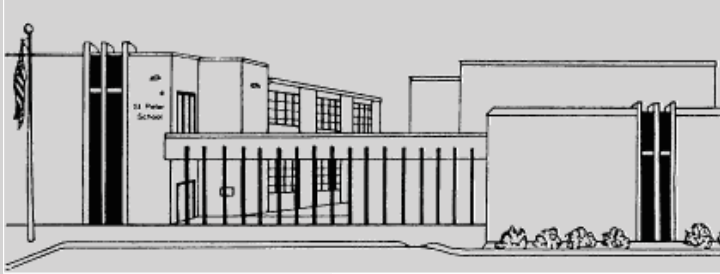
During the Season of Lent, we will be celebrating our morning Mass during the weekdays, with an additional Mass from Monday to Friday at 6:30 p.m. In addition to the Mass, on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, we will also be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 5:45-6:15 p.m. on those weekdays. Then on Thursdays after Mass, we will be showing a video series on the Eucharist. In light of this being the year of the Eucharist, a renewal of our understanding of this great sacrament would be a fitting Lenten devotion. I also ask that you consult the other parts of the bulletin for our Lenten regulations.

To prepare ourselves for our Lenten practices, I want to invite all of you to our parish mission beginning this weekend. Fr. Denis Robinson, a Benedictine monk from St. Meinrad seminary, will be here with us to preach at all of our Masses and then to offer another presentation on Sunday and Monday night at 6:30 p.m. He will discuss the Eucharist in the context of Lent/the coming of Christ’s passion, death and resurrection at Easter. For those who need it, we will have childcare available for children age 1 and older in the cafeteria. A reception will follow in the narthex after the conference on Monday. Please make it a point to be present and to use this as an opportunity to begin your Lenten journey on the right foot.

As another opportunity for growth in our faith, the Men’s group will have their Spring program using the series by Fr. Dave Pivonka called “Metanoia” beginning next Friday, February 24 in the St. Peter School gym. Doors open at 6:00 p.m. and the program begins at 6:30 finishing by 7:30 a.m. You are invited to make this a part of your Lenten journey.

During our Lenten journey, we are hoping that some of our parishioners who have lost a loved one will attend some grief sessions to be on Thursday evenings from 4:30-6:30 p.m. in the rectory. These five sessions will begin on Feb. 23. For more information, please contact Rebecca at the parish office.

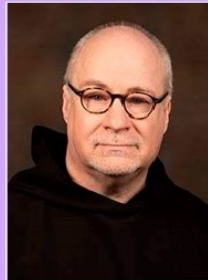

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

1. FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
