

"On The Q/T..."

From the devotional, "God Calling," A.J. Russel, ed. Meditation of March 1st, "God at Eventide": "It is not upon one battle alone that all depends, or there would be no hope for those who fail me. You enter upon a long campaign when you enter my army. Is the battle lost? Acquaint yourself with the cause, discover your weakness, and with dauntless faith, go forth resolved this time to conquer. No man can conquer who has not learned his weakness, nor made ready for the next conflict, and who does not know and claim and trust My strength, always available when summoned, as you have already proved."

On to the question from Fr. Tony:

To search out the cause of failures in life, to discover personal weakness, and to know and claim the total strength of Jesus Christ to conquer is prayer time well spent anytime, let alone the season of Lent. And it's that last one - to know and to claim the Lord's total strength - upon which Jesus Himself places such great emphasis. Do you really believe that there's nothing he cannot do, that *apart from* the mystery of his will, there's no doubt that he can do the impossible if the impossible is called for. "If you believe in me," He says in the Gospel, over and over again. His answers are "Yes," "No," or "Wait". But *apart from that*, on my side of things, is there any doubt about his power to save?

The Catholic Church's Observance of the Season of Lent. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious, and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

- 1. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023 and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 22, and Good Friday, April 15, 2023.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

March 31, SHDC (Stations of the Cross and Mass, 5:15 p.m.)


