First Sunday of Lent

FEBRUARY 26, 2023

Genesis 2:7-9;3:1-7; Romans 5:12-19; Matthew 4:1-11

All suffering and evil in this world are traceable to the original sin of our First Parents. Snakes never talked, and probably the sin was not the eating of an apple or other fruit. Whatever the sin was, it was self-deception. When our First Parents sinned, they lost for themselves and for all their descendants the gift of sharing God's life (grace), the gift of immortality, and the gift of freedom from suffering.

As sin entered through the one man, Adam, so grace and life are restored by the new Adam, Jesus Christ. By his life, death, and resurrection, Jesus puts death to death, restores life to us, and imparts his Spirit to us.

But we are still capable of sinning again. Like our First Parents, we can deceive ourselves. The temptations of Jesus are not like our temptations. We are always tempted at our most vulnerable point.

For Jesus, it was a temptation to be the kind of glorious Messiah people expected. It was a temptation to use his divine power for his own benefit. It was a temptation to avoid the ordeal of the cross by some spectacular act which would compel belief.

Our temptations are different. We must constantly guard against self-deception, against rationalizing, against indifference, and against presumption. It is easy for us to justify ourselves because "everyone" else is doing it. It is easy to put off repentance because "there's always time." It is easy to think that we have "more important things to do" than to do the religious bit

One day we shall stand alone before the judgment seat of God. Will our excuses stand up? Use Lent as the time to be more fervent in prayer, more generous in charity, more eager in celebrating the mysteries of faith.


Dear Parishioners,

On this last weekend in our month of February, the Church celebrates the First Sunday in our season of Lent. On this First Sunday, we will be sending over to the Cathedral in Springfield our catechumens who will be celebrating with the Bishop the Rite of Election. At our 9:30 Mass, as the local Church we will be celebrating what is called the Rite of Sending. This is a special rite including prayers by which we recommend to the Bishop these people who are being called to the Easter sacraments, namely, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. They will sign the Book of the Elect which will also be taken to Springfield with them to have the Bishop sign the same Book. After our sending forth, our catechumens (those not baptized) will participate in the Rite of Election with the Bishop and will, after today, be formally called the Elect. This word basically means that the Church recognizes the call of God in their lives and confirms that call by their election to the final stages of preparation to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. As we send them forth today, I ask you to keep them in your prayers as we support them in this final stage of conversion of heart.

Our gospel reading for this First Sunday in our season of Lent is Matthew's presentation of the temptation of Jesus in the desert. In the three temptations, Jesus is confronted with differing desires which would go contrary to what His Father was calling Him to live. The first was to turn bread to stone, thus alleviating His hunger after fasting for forty days. In other words, He was challenged to use His power for Himself, something contrary to His Father's calling. The second temptation was to throw Himself down from the parapet of the temple, thus compromising with evil in order to bring out some good. Again, such a temptation was rejected. The third and final one was to worship the devil and in turn the devil would give to Him all the kingdoms of the earth. But Jesus saw right through that temptation as no one is converted based upon some spectacular one time event. And thus that temptation was dismissed. As we look at Jesus' temptation, we might look into our own lives to see how we are tempted. And when we begin to grasp our temptations, we begin to understand the flaws and weaknesses of our human nature. For temptations never are challenges to our strong points of character but always reflect where we are the weakest. And it is in those areas that Lent challenges us to overcome. So what are your temptations? If we can identity them, then we can grow in God's graces.

This weekend, we celebrate QND commitment weekend. By now you will have received a letter from me, asking you to contribute to the QND annual fund that is taking place in our community. This weekend is the parish side of this annual fund. QND is one of those rich treasures that we have in our community, a gift of Catholic education for our young people in challenging years of their lives, namely, high school years. In order to assist them in these years, we are committed to a mission of supporting their religious education through our support of Quincy Notre Dame High School. I ask you to consider a donation to Quincy Notre Dame High School in order to preserve this rich legacy that has been handed to us from generations of the past and make it possible to help our school grow ever more through this generation of the present.

Dear Msgr. Leo:

It is always a joy for me to write to you and to the members of St. Peter to inform you of our ongoing activities. During the last few months, the reality is the same. The difference is that the children were able to go back to school with joy after 4 months of involuntary vacation. Then, the political and the socio-economic aspects of the country, the reality has not changed. The people still face higher cost of living, social insecurity, political uncertainty, and food insecurity. People can move more each day despite the insecurity and the high price of fuel which is sold at \$10 in the black market. Some gas stations, I heard, bought the fuel in the Dominican Republic. The Haitian government seems to be untouched by the misery and the tribulation of the suffering families.

In our parish, we are doing our best to keep going. We still can buy food at a higher price and go to the mission churches to say mass for God's people. It is always a joy for them to see their priest. We stay close to them to encourage them and give them hope for hope doesn't disappoint. We organize small groups of adult formation for them in Passe-Reine and in the Mission Churches, Chemin Neuf and Garoty.

During the Christmas season, on Christmas Eve, I offered the people who came to church something to eat after church. There were around one hundred. On Christmas Day, I said mass in the main church at Passe-Reine and at St. Leo the Great in Garoty. Later, on December 28th, I had a Christmas party for the kids and offered them breakfast and a hot meal. There were 220. And, I did go to the neighborhood to distribute some hot meals to 85 people knowing how difficult the situation is. They rejoiced and ate their meals with great appetite. In some way, it is at the same time very sad to notice a great number of people not having the means to feed themselves and their families. Holding a piece of chicken to eat means a lot for the poor in Haiti today. Everything is so expensive. Your generosity allowed me to offer that opportunity to so many people. I am able to share your

blessings with them. You are double blessed to share your blessings with the less fortunate people in giving. God sees all. I will continue to pray for all of you at St. Peter. Pray also for me and for the people in Haiti, especially your sister parish.

Thank you for your recent donation, thank you for supporting our parish family. May God bless you and all of the members of Saint Peter Parish in Quincy!
