

About the Season of Lent This Week: Thursday evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Hour takes place at ICC and SPPN, 7 to 8 p.m. Stations of the Cross, Mass, and Fish Fry return to ICC: Stations of the Cross, 5:15 p.m.; Mass to follow.

Masses of St. Pius V and St. Paul VI series continues this Sunday at the Villa Marie Rectory, 2-3 p.m. We'll have a "lab practical" on switching from English to Latin, and back! Easier done than said - and yes, that's exactly the way we want to put it!!

No Masses March 14. Fr. Tony will be in Peoria with Bishop Tylka and the priests of the diocese as a part of the Growing Disciples Diocesan Discernment Process.

March 17 Dispensation! Bishop Tylka has issued a dispensation from Friday abstinence from meat in honor of St. Patrick's Day. But let's stick to fish, OK? Green fish. Yum Yum.

Spanish Mass at IC Beginning on Easter Sunday evening at 5 p.m., and then continuing on the second Sunday of every month at 5 p.m. thereafter, there will be a Spanish Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage. In keeping with the history of the National Churches of the United States between the mid-1800's and mid-1900's, the Spanish speaking population of our surrounding area will enjoy a monthly Mass with the use of their language and prayer customs. The passage of time will allow the movement toward assimilation into the culture of the United States. Now, it's the Mass, in whatever the language! So, it goes without saying that all are invited.

This Lent set aside some time to spend with the Lord in Quiet. Eucharistic Adoration will be available Thursday nights from 7 to 8 p.m. in the following locations, March 16 Carthage and Nauvoo, March 23 Warsaw and Dallas City and March 30 Hamilton and Nauvoo.
