

From A Simple Path: Mother of Teresa of Calcutta, by Lucinda Varney: "A lot of men who come to our AIDS homes arrive full of despair. But after the tender care of our sisters and volunteers they find peace in their hearts. So, it is really a homecoming for them when they come to our houses. Many say, 'This will be the last place I'll live, the last place I'll be, "and I have always said, 'No this is the last but one. From here you have to go to your true home where our heavenly Father is waiting.' And many long to go. Thursday evening Adoration and Holy Hour, 7 to 8pm will be at SHW and SHDC. Friday evening Stations of the Cross at 5:15, with Mass to follow, and Fish Fry is at SHW, this time around.

All Roads Lead Here: The latest news? 60% participation! Thank you for your support, your confidence, and your belief in the need for our Hancock County Churches. We are the Body of Christ on this earth; we are the Church. And we're coming through in terrific fashion.

What is Mass "Ad Orientem"? Is it the priest with his back to the people? Or is it the priest facing the same direction as the people? Isn't the priest "people," too? Do I already like it? Do I already not like it? Tell you what: why don't we just let all of us experience what it is? On the weekend of March 25-26th, at all of our churches, Mass will be celebrated with the priest facing the same direction as the people, toward the tabernacle, and then "upward" toward the crucifix and/or the statue of the Sacred Heart. We' re talking about twenty minutes in the middle of the Mass where the priest will be praying the Mass from the other side of the altar - without moving the altar. Please allow yourself to experience this; give it a try. Whatever your reactions are, they are most welcome; it's one of the reasons we're doing this: to encourage your reactions. Like it better? Fine. Don't like it at all? OK, too. In no way are we preparing you for some future plan, without telling you exactly what it is. Know what you're talking about, before you talk about it. Plain and simple. Let's scale down this "better way," "only way," to go to Mass talk.

Easter Vigil, SHDC: Thank you, Youth Group. The members of our recently established Youth Group will assist the deacons and me in the ministries of the Easter Vigil. Servers, Readers, Gift bearers, all of it: we ask the consideration and understanding of our adult ministers usually called to service at the altar. Our young parishioners have much to give: much to say. We hope to hear reflections on the readings at Mass from them in the future. More next week, about the Holy Week Schedule.

Too Early to Talk About Flowers for Easter? Given, that we'll have only two Masses on Easter Sunday, at SHW and SMH: that means that we'll have Easter lilies in our other churches for a week without for the most part actually seeing them. The more we have to work with not only lilies, but also various flowers to festively portray and decorate our sanctuaries throughout the Easter season - the better. So please consider a donation, or a donation memorial for our Easter decorations. More about this, in the following weeks.

Pius V and Paul VI Masses Series. This Sunday, 2 to 3pm, at the Villa. This session, we'll take a look at the point of the celebration of the sacrifice of the Mass: the worship of Jesus Christ - the way He made clear He wants to be worshipped. Focus on God - not on us: should make for interesting discussion!

Spanish Mass at IC Beginning on Easter Sunday evening at 5pm, and then continuing on the second Sunday of every month at 5pm thereafter, there will be a Spanish Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage. In keeping with the history of the National Churches of the United States between the mid-1800's and mid-1900's, the Spanish speaking population of our surrounding area will enjoy a monthly Mass with the use of their language and prayer customs. The passage of time will allow the movement toward assimilation into the culture of the United States. Now, it's the Mass, in whatever the language! So, it goes without saying that all are invited.

This Lent set aside some time to spend with the Lord in Quiet. Eucharistic Adoration will be available Thursday nights from 7 to 8 pm in the following locations, Mar. 23 Warsaw and Dallas City and Mar. 30 Hamilton and Nauvoo.


