

**About the Season of Lent This Week.** Wednesday evening Stations of the Cross and Mass begin at 5:15 p.m. at SHDC. Thursday evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Hour, 7-8 p.m., takes place on March 30 at SMH and SPPN. Friday evening Stations of the Cross and Mass begin at 5:15 p.m. at SHDC; and SHDC takes its turn at our Friday Fish Fries - the last of the season of Lent. Let's make our attendance as great as it's been at all the others!

**You Think You Have Questions? Do I Ever Have Questions!** By the time your eyes meet this announcement, you will have participated at a Mass during which the priest stood on the opposite side of the altar, priest and people facing the altar and tabernacle together. Not to make this a therapy session...but any feelings arising from the experience? Questions? Likes or dislikes? Something that enriches or encroaches upon your spirituality? **Pius V and Paul VI Masses Series.** The last session this Sunday, 2-3 p.m. We'll continue with the thoughts of Pope Benedict - the theologian - on the advantages of both rites, and prospects for the future of the structure of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

**Growing Disciples.** The Bishop's Meeting with the Priests of the diocese last week yielded discussion about alignment of churches and even vicariates before moving forward with discernment of the direction of the Holy Spirit for all of us. Nothing about parish or vicariate alignment changes for us. Selected parish leaders along with their pastors will be meeting on April 30 as this level of discussion continues.

**Too Early to Talk About Flowers for Easter?** Given, that we'll have only two Masses on Easter Sunday, at SHW and SMH: that means that we'll have Easter lilies in our other churches for a week without for the most part actually seeing them. The more we have to work with - not only lilies, but also various flowers to festively portray and decorate our sanctuaries throughout the Easter season - the better. So please consider a donation, or a donation memorial for our Easter decorations. More about this, in the following weeks.

**Spanish Mass at IC Beginning on Easter Sunday evening at 5 p.m.,** and then continuing on the second Sunday of every month at 5 p.m. thereafter, there will be a Spanish Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage. In keeping with the history of the National Churches of the United States between the mid-1800's and mid-1900's, the Spanish speaking population of our surrounding area will enjoy a monthly Mass with the use of their language and prayer customs. The passage of time will allow the movement toward assimilation into the culture of the United States. Now, it's the Mass, in whatever the language! So, it goes without saying that all are invited.
