

Here's How Things Look for Holy Week. **About the Season of Lent This Week.** Wednesday evening Stations of the Cross and Mass begin at 5:15 p.m. at SHDC. Thursday evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Hour, 7-8 p.m., takes place on March 30 at SMH and SPPN. Friday evening Stations of the Cross and Mass begin at 5:15 p.m. at SHDC; and SHDC takes its turn at our Friday Fish Fries - the last of the season of Lent. Let's make our attendance as great as it's been at all the others!

**Too Early to Talk About Flowers for Easter?** Given, that we'll have only two Masses on Easter Sunday, at SHW and SMH: that means that we'll have Easter lilies in our other churches for a week without for the most part actually seeing them. The more we have to work with not only lilies, but also various flowers to festively portray and decorate our sanctuaries throughout the Easter season - the better. So please consider a donation, or a donation memorial for our Easter decorations. More about this, in the following weeks.

**Spanish Mass at IC Beginning on Easter Sunday evening at 5 p.m.**, and then continuing on the second Sunday of every month at 5 p.m. thereafter, there will be a Spanish Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Carthage. In keeping with the history of the National Churches of the United States between the mid-1800's and mid-1900's, the Spanish speaking population of our surrounding area will enjoy a monthly Mass with the use of their language and prayer customs. 
