Fifth Sunday of Lent

MARCH 26, 2023

Ezekiel 37:12-14; Romans 8:8-11;
John 11:1-45

In Jewish expectation, the most obvious sign of the coming of the Messiah was the resurrection of the dead. Hebrews did not distinguish between “body” and “soul;” those are Greek philosophical categories. To the Hebrews, a human person was an animated body; if there was to be life after death, it had to be by way of the resurrection of the body.

Early Judaism knew nothing of life after death; late Judaism developed the idea of life after death because of the expectation of the Messiah. The Messiah would bring an era of perfect joy to this earth. The living would live forever. But what about the dead? They thought that it would be unjust of God not to raise the righteous who had died before the Messiah came.

The expectation is expressed in the first reading. In the Gospel, the seventh and last of Jesus’ “signs” is the raising of Lazarus. But note that this is a sign of our own resurrection to glory. Lazarus would die again. But those who believe in Jesus will never taste eternal death. Jesus promises that he has conquered death. Whoever lives and believes in him will conquer any fear of death; he is assured that he will live forever in the glory of Christ.

In the second reading the contrast is made between “spirit” and “flesh.” “Spirit” here does not mean “soul,” and “flesh” here does not mean “body.” Here, “flesh” means the entire human person considered as living without Christ; i.e. the human person under the reign of sin.

“Spirit” means the entire human person considered as living under the reign of Christ. A good synonym for “spirit” would be “grace.” Because we live in Christ (in grace) we shall live forever; we shall rise from the dead bodily because we share the life of Christ spiritually.

If we share with Christ, we must show this in our lives. We must show by our attitude, our words, and our actions, that we believe that we have conquered death; we must be a people of joy who radiate the power of Christ’s love.

Today we celebrate the third and last of the Scrutinies with our Elect. The emphasis is on the resurrection which they will experience in their baptism on Holy Saturday. With them, let us pledge that we shall daily die to self and that we shall daily rise to share the life and love of the risen Christ. Our share in the resurrection of Christ in this life is our life of grace.

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT

From the desk of our DRE...

How long has it been since you were a small child and a beloved adult held your hand? Picture in your mind being a small child again. Grab the hand of your most beloved person. Walk hand in hand. Hold that thought.

I have a confession: I was a “dollar in the plate” giver for many years. I regret the good I did not do. I made excuses: We’re not rich. We’re generous with our time and talent. The economy isn’t fair. I need to pay off debt. I’ll give later. I need my money.

Helping with PreCana (marriage prep) days changed me. The presenter couples shared stories of giving back to God and God always having their back. One couple decided to give more at church. Then the dryer died. With small children, laundry was constant. They would have to give less, to buy a dryer. Then the phone rang: someone was moving, and had an extra dryer. Did they need one? Another couple went from financial ruin to debt free with Dave Ramsey, who advises giving a Biblical tithe (ten percent) because, “the money’s not mine.”

These couples were so joyful to build up God’s Kingdom on earth, to do good with their money! They didn’t give with strings attached, but freely out of gratitude. They shared Scriptures that convicted me: “The earth is the Lord’s and everything in it.” Psalm 24:1 and “Bring the full tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house; and thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil; and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the LORD of hosts.” Malachi 3:10-11

The fifth precept of the Church is “Help provide for the needs of the Church.” God’s math is too big to fit on my budget spreadsheet. Since I started tithing several years ago, I’ve seen Him provide for me and my children in unexpected ways again and again. My tithe check is my favorite check to write. My little hand is in His big hand, and I love walking with Him.

Please keep Fr. Arisman in your prayers as he has the honor of being the Spiritual Director for Cursillo #359 this weekend. Pray that the Holy Spirit guides Fr. Arisman and all of the men on this journey.

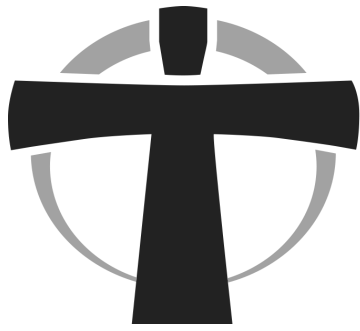
Ladies of St. Francis News:
