



March 26, 2023 Fifth Sunday of Lent

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Lent is rapidly passing away, bringing us in these last two weeks to "Passiontide". Our focus now intensifies, shifting from our own sinfulness and need of conversion, to the passion and cross of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The Church recommends the tradition of covering statues and images out of a spirit of increasing austerity, fasting even from images that please our eyes. The crucifix itself can be covered out of shame for our responsibility for Christ's sufferings. The growing desolation reaches a climax on Holy Thursday and Good Friday as the

Holy Water fonts are emptied, the altar is stripped, and votive candles are extinguished. Music is sung with minimal or no accompaniment, blessings are not given during the liturgical celebrations, and the Blessed Sacrament itself taken out of the Church. Mass is not to be celebrated anywhere in the world on Good Friday or until nightfall on Holy Saturday. In these final weeks, we are called to intensify our disciplines, that we may finish Lent well and celebrate the entire 50 days of Easter with newfound appreciation for the sacraments of the Church and the other 'little joys' of everyday life.



Empower Illinois is the program that provides private school need-based scholarships to students and their families, while returning donors a 75% Illinois State income tax rebate for the funds they give. This is perhaps one of the very best deals around for your charitable dollars! I have recently completed my own donation for the year, taking the money I received from my tax refund. From my \$2,000 donation, I designated students and families at St. Dominic School to receive these scholarship funds, and I in turn am receiving a \$1500 tax credit from the state of Illinois for my 2023 income taxes (which will come due *next* April). This is

a great deal, in that my effective out-of-pocket expense is \$500, but the benefit is multiplied 4 times. And to make that better, through April 15, there is a private party who has agreed to match donations to Empower Illinois up to \$10,000 for St. Dominic School. Thus, for a net \$500 cost, my donation is providing nearly \$4000 in benefit to St. Dominic Families. I would like to encourage parishioners to join me in this effort to complete the \$10,000 challenge by April!

The process of signing up for the Empower Illinois program is a little bit involved... not difficult, but there are a number of steps that can be confusing for those not familiar with them. In order to encourage and help parishioners and friends who would like to make an Empower Illinois donation, St. Dominic School will be hosting a 'help night' this Tuesday at 5 p.m. in the St. Dominic School computer lab. There will be two sessions... one will assist users in establishing a *mytax.illinois.gov* account. This process will be complete the first night and then users will receive a mailing to activate/ authorize their account with the Department of Revenue. A second session will then be held in April to complete the forms with DOR and Empower Illinois and to receive donations in time for the matching-funds challenge.

For individuals, their donations can be directed to St. Dominic School, Quincy Notre Dame High School, or another recognized private school of your choice. (Corporate entities in Illinois can also make donations to the larger pool for the entire state, but cannot target their donation for a specific school.) The tax credits are good for up to five years, so if you don't use the credit against your income tax liability in one year, it can be held over for four more tax years. The tax credit is reported on IL-Schedule 1299-C of your tax return, which is available for filing in all major tax software packages available to individuals and tax professionals.

We encourage our parishioners to consult their tax advisor and consider supporting this wonderful program. Even if you are unable to participate in the 'matching challenge' this April, Empower Illinois donations can be made throughout the year, but must be completed by December 31, 2023 in order to be used for taxes due in 2024.
