## Fifth Sunday of Lent

**MARCH 26. 2023** 

Ezekiel 37:12-14; Romans 8:8-11; John 11:1-45

In Jewish expectation, the most obvious sign of the coming of the Messiah was the resurrection of the dead. Hebrews did not distinguish between "body" and "soul;" those are Greek philosophical categories. To the Hebrews, a human person was an animated body; if there was to be life after death, it had to be by way of the resurrection of the body.

Early Judaism knew nothing of life after death; late Judaism developed the idea of life after death because of the expectation of the Messiah. The Messiah would bring an era of perfect joy to this earth. The living would live forever. But what about the dead? They thought that it would be unjust of God not to raise the righteous who had died before the Messiah came.

The expectation is expressed in the first reading. In the Gospel, the seventh and last of Jesus' "signs" is the raising of Lazarus. But note that this is a sign of our own resurrection to glory. Lazarus would die again. But those who believe in Jesus will never taste eternal death. Jesus promises that he has conquered death. Whoever lives and believes in him will conquer any fear of death; he is assured that he will live forever in the glory of Christ.

In the second reading the contrast is made between "spirit" and "flesh." "Spirit" here does not mean "soul," and "flesh" here does not mean "body." Here, "flesh" means the entire human person considered as living without Christ; i.e. the human person under the reign of sin.

"Spirit" means the entire human person considered as living under the reign of Christ. A good synonym for "spirit" would be "grace." Because we live in Christ (in grace) we shall live forever; we shall rise from the dead bodily because we share the life of Christ spiritually.

If we share with Christ, we must show this in our lives. We must show by our attitude, our words, and our actions, that we believe that we have conquered death; we must be a people of joy who radiate the power of

Christ's love.

Today we celebrate the third and last of the Scrutinies with our Elect. The emphasis is on the resurrection which they will experience in their baptism on Holy Saturday. With them, let us pledge that we shall daily die to self and that we shall daily rise to share the life and love of the risen Christ. Our share in the resurrection of Christ in this life is our life of grace.


#### Dear Parishioners,

Well, I don't know about you, but I am rejoicing that the season of Spring has arrived. I only hope that someone tells Mother Nature and the weather begins to reflect this arrival. It's not that we had a terrible winter, but I know that I am more than ready for the new life in nature. As I reflect upon the past three weeks, I have to admit that the month of March is rapidly coming to an end and the thought of snow and cold weather is becoming more a thing of the past than the present—I only hope because the minute I say that, we will have an unexpected snow storm or ice even in April. Pray that the thought of such a thing happening is only a bad dream or perhaps something I ate. Whatever the case, Spring is here in terms of the calendar and we hope that the calendar is correct in reality.

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we also celebrate at the 9:30 a.m. Mass the final Scrutiny for our Elect (catechumens, those to be baptized). In this Scrutiny, we hear the Gospel of John concerning the raising of Lazarus from the dead. What we find in this gospel are several points that the Church wants us to remember. The first point is that Jesus has power over life and now death; that Jesus who came that we might have life, is also the one through whom we have new life in the resurrection. Within this gospel regarding Lazarus' death and his restoration to life, we find Jesus saying to Martha what He says to all of us, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if that person dies, will live, and everyone who believes in me will never die." Then Jesus asks Martha and us a very interesting question, "Do you believe this?" There are times that we might wonder what this means and what our answers might mean. But I know from my own life, without answering "yes" to this question of Jesus, the many deaths that I have experienced are meaningless. But with the answer, "yes, Lord I do believe," then there is hope in the midst of death. The second point made in this gospel is that Jesus has come to set us free from all the things that bind us here on earth, including death. What we find is Jesus saying to us the very words He said to Lazarus, "come out." And Lazarus came out, tied hand and foot with burial cords. This is a reflection of sin in our lives, sin that leads to death. With Jesus bringing forgiveness and mercy into our lives, He tells us to come out of our self-imposed graves and be free of the things that bind us. His forgiveness and mercy are the signs of being restored to new life that this gospel provides for us. So instead of hearing "Lazarus, come out," try substituting your name and hear Jesus saying to you, "\_\_\_\_\_\_, come out." Jesus's final words were, \_\_, come out." Jesus's final words were. "untie him and let him go." That's what His forgiveness does for us.

On Sunday, April 2, we are making available to our parishioners and the entire Catholic community of Quincy a Penance service to be held here at St. Peter Church at 2:00 p.m. We will have a number of priests present for individual confession. Please use this opportunity to hear Jesus saying to you this Sunday, "untie him (her) and let him (her) go." Then after this Penance Service, we will be celebrating the Stations of the Cross, probably around 3:30 p.m. This devotional practice will celebrate the Stations from the perspective of Mary. So I invite you to come and join us for Reconciliation and for this traditional practice of walking with Christ to His journey to Calvary.

It's been said that you can't teach an old dog new tricks. That's the way that I feel in terms of changes in our liturgy. Recently, the Church changed the wording of the words of absolution used in our Rite of Penance, so that they are more in line with the Latin. It's not much of a change, a couple of words (underlined below) but unless I am looking at it, I seem to fall back on the old translation. So for those interested, the words are the following: "God the Father of mercies, through the death and the resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself, and poured out the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace. AND I ABSOLVE YOU FROM YOUR SINS IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN




