

## "On The Q/T..."

From *God Calling*, A.J. Russell, ed. *Meditation of March 4th*: "I said in Gethsemane, 'If it be possible let this cup pass.' I did *not* say that there was no cup of sorrow to drink. I was scourged and spat upon and nailed to the Cross, and I said, 'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.' I did *not* say they did not do it. When my disciple, Peter, urged me to escape the Cross, I said, 'Get thee behind me, Satan.' When my disciples failed to help the epileptic boy, I said, 'This kind comes not out but by prayer and fasting.' I did *not* say, 'You imagined that he was ill. Nothing is wrong....'"

## On to the question from Fr. Tony:

One of the rules of spiritual warfare is to recognize that the evil spirits are real, and that they cannot abide anything or anyone good. It's the nature of the eternal hatred of the demons that they have to tear away at the good - *if* they can't turn the good to evil. For example: if you are happy and confident that you have a good family, and that you are holding true to high moral standards according to faith in Jesus Christ, buckle your seatbelts: you're going to be spiritually attacked. Some little thing simmering over many years explodes; some little unravelling leads to hurts that cause distances that are almost impossible to bridge. Excuses for people you love take the place of firm stands against wrong decisions: that kind of thing. So: did you really think that you were beyond this kind of thing ever happening to you? And are you feisty enough to get back what you're on the verge of losing? Are you really the type to let losing that big, happen?

**No major meetings this March; however,....** because the season of Lent is upon us, our Finance Councils, Pastoral Council, and Education Commission are not on a schedule of meetings this month. But this *is* the month for budget formulation for the next fiscal year. Keep us in your prayers as we set meeting times, include parishioners in the work of the budget, and review estimates that have been determined during the month of February, to insure as accurate a projection into the future year as possible.

**About the Season of Lent this week.** Thursday evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place from 7 to 8 pm at SHDC and SMH. Stations of the Cross, Mass, and fish fry return to SPPN and the Alleman Council Knights of Columbus, Nauvoo. And don't forget the Stations of the Cross for SPPS students, 2pm, Friday, at SPPN.

**This Lent set aside some time to spend with the Lord in Quiet.** Eucharistic Adoration will be available Thursday nights from 7 to 8 pm in the following locations: Mar. 9 Dallas City and Hamilton, Mar. 16 Carthage and Nauvoo, Mar. 23 Warsaw and Dallas City and Mar. 30 Hamilton and Nauvoo.

**Masses of the Council of Trent and Vatican meets Sunday, March 5th, from 2 to 3pm at the Villa Marie Rectory in Nauvoo.** After last Sunday's session on the history of the Councils of Trent, Vatican I, and Vatican II, we'll be looking at the Scriptural foundations and structure of the Rites of the Masses of St. Pius V and St. Paul VI - the Latin and the English Masses, as we've come to know them.

**We've had the beginnings of a High School Youth Group for a while, NOW.** The group is at fifteen members, and we started quietly by word of mouth: no public advertising. But the members decided it's time to get the word out. While the meetings are scheduled irregularly, they are monthly, from 7 to 8pm, at the ICC Parish Center. Work in progress, as they say: but we're going to grow. Really a great group. We'll keep you posted on meeting times from now on!
