Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday)

APRIL 2, 2023

(For Palm procession: Matthew 21:1-11;) for Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Matthew 26:14–27:66

The liturgy today is a paradox because the Paschal Mystery is a paradox! Victory comes through apparent defeat; real life comes only through death; glory comes through suffering patiently borne; there is no crown without first the cross.

The Palm Sunday procession honors Christ as our King. This means that we accept him as Lord over our lives. But the Gospel of Mass tells of the suffering and death of Jesus! Did those who shouted "Hosanna!" on Palm Sunday also shout "Crucify him!" six days later? Or were they merely silent, allowing evil to triumph?

The first reading is the third of the Suffering Servant Songs in Isaiah. These four songs describe an "everyman" who takes all grief and agony of the world to himself. By his suffering, he vicariously heals all. These songs or poems were used by the primitive Church to explain how the Messiah could suffer.

The second reading was a liturgical hymn before Paul incorporated it into his letter to the Philippians about 58 A.D. The ancient hymn expresses the Paschal Mystery: Christ is God from all eternity, but he did not cling to the majesty of God; he made himself as nothing in becoming man. And he became humbler yet, obedient to the worst possible death, death on the cross. Because of his humility and obedience, he is exalted and glorified.

The Passion according to Matthew is today's Gospel. Jesus is rejected by the leaders of his own people. Although he is crucified by the Romans, the Roman soldiers proclaim that Jesus surely is the Son of God! In meditating on the Passion, put yourself into the picture; identify with the characters.

This week we celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Let us live that mystery in our lives: We must die to self in order to live to God. We must take up the cross if we want to share Christ's crown of glory.

Dear Parishioners,

The month of April has arrived and I only hope that the weather will begin to reflect what this month implies, springtime temperature, grasses turning green again, and the trees taking on their leaves, all reflecting the new life born each year at this time. How appropriate that as we usher in this new life this week that we call it HOLY WEEK. For this week leads to the cause of new life for all of us as we celebrate the Paschal Mystery, namely, the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus our Savior.


To begin this Holiest of Weeks, the Church celebrates this day what is called Palm Sunday. We hear in the introduction for this day the following: "Since the beginning of Lent util now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal mystery, that is to say of His Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that He entered His own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in His footsteps, so that, being made by His grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share in His Resurrection and in His life."

During this Holy Week, the priests and laity will gather in Springfield to celebrate the Chrism Mass with the Bishop. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless the following oils to be used in the parishes of his diocese for the sacramental life of the Church: Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens. By the blessing of these oils by the Bishop, the Bishop will be present at each of the sacraments in which these oils will be used.

Moving on from Tuesday, we celebrate the three most Sacred Days in our Church calendar. These celebrations are called the "Triduum," meaning three days. The Triduum begins with the celebration of the Lord's Last Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6. This celebration will be at 7:00 p.m. Since the Triduum is one sacred liturgy encompassing three days, we move next into celebration of the Lord's Passion with Holy Communion on Good Friday, April 7, also at 7:00 p.m. Finally, the concluding liturgy of the Triduum is the celebration of Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, April 8, at 8:00 p.m. I encourage you to take part in our liturgies this year and make it a priority to be present and experience the Church coming alive in its beautiful liturgy. Finally, our celebration of Easter Sunday, April 9, will have Masses at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 a.m. Please save this bulletin for future references for these times this week.

We will also be having special times for Confessions beginning this weekend. This Sunday, we will have a Community Wide Penance Service here at St. Peter Church at 2:00 p.m. Many of our priests from the area will be here for individual confessions. Let's try to make this a priority. We will also be having Confessions on Holy Thursday, 3:00-5:00 p.m. and then on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, from 11:00 to Noon and from 3:00-5:00 p.m. After the Confessions this Sunday, I invite you to stay for the Stations of the Cross from Mary's Perspective. This beautiful commemoration will begin about 3:30 p.m.

Also, after the Stations of the Cross this Sunday afternoon, we will be having our annual Red Beans and Rice dinner in the cafeteria sponsored by the Social Concerns Committee of the parish. Please join us.
