

#### What the Empty Tomb on Easter Sunday Means

There was, once upon a time, a priest of our diocese whose name was Father Fitzsimmonds. He gave a sermon at a funeral I attended some 25 years ago. He stated that at the root of every sin are three attitudes: I'm not going to die; nobody's going to find out; and what I do isn't going to hurt anybody. Never seems like a sin when we're committing it. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ gives us a tremendous opportunity, of which we can take advantage any and every day, any and every moment of every day. Without getting morbid about it, we can keep in mind that we aren't staying here; we're meant for eternal life. We can remember all the people whom we hope weren't watching us when "we were heading down the wrong road" were always present in our hearts. And we can squarely face what our thoughts, words and actions have done to others, if only in the spiritual realm. It's called sorrow for our sins and change of life. You see, because of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, sorrow for sins and change of life means something: forgiveness and entry into eternal life at the moment of death. Keep in mind what the empty tomb on Easter Sunday means. And that means the same thing as the Holy Sacrifice of every Mass.
