# Resurrection of the Lord

**APRIL 9, 2023** 

Acts 10:34a,37-43; Colossians 3:1-4; John 20:1-9

The message of the primitive Church was simple: Jesus was the anointed of God (the Messiah) who went about doing good, but was killed by evil people. But God raised him up. In him we have the forgiveness of our sins, and we shall share in his resurrection!

Today's first reading is a sermon by Peter to those who would be the first Gentile or non-Jewish converts to Christianity. The risen Jesus was not seen by everyone, but was seen by many reliable witnesses.

The second reading reminds us that we share in the Lord's resurrection by our baptism. We have died to sin; we have been raised up to grace. So we must now live lives which seek what is above, rather than what is below.

Through our baptism we were called to perfection; most of us have failed. But during Lent we have done penance; we have experienced the Lord's mercy. Now we renew our baptismal promises that we shall be dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel seems simple and straightforward. Mary Magdalene tells Peter and John that she has seen the risen Lord. They run to the tomb. The younger, "beloved disciple," outruns Peter, but waits for him. They see the burial garments.

So why do they believe? First of all, because of the empty tomb. The Romans had stationed a guard there so that no one might steal the body of Jesus; yet the tomb was empty. Second, if someone stole the body, they would not take time or trouble to slip off the burial garments.

But third, in the original language, the sentence which we translate "wrappings on the ground" is much more profound! It should be translated that they saw the burial garments "still in their folds" or "still with the contour of the body." If someone had ripped off the burial garments, they would not maintain the contour of a body! But here it was, as if the body had simply evaporated! There could be no other explanation except the resurrection!

So what does this mean for you? If Christ Jesus has risen, the faith is true. There is life eternal. There is forgiveness – provided that we follow the Lord with all our heart. Let us renew the fervor of our faith and be loyal to Jesus Christ each day.

# Sacrament of Reconciliation

#### Dear Parishioners,

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Alleluia! There is no greater introduction to our Easter celebration than the words of the Responsorial Psalm for our Mass today on Easter. Yes, today is a day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad. Jesus has taken upon Himself the greatest fear that we have, namely that of sin and death, and has conquered both with His Resurrection. And perhaps the best utterance that we can have is truly the words of this Psalm for this is the day that the Lord has made. It is the cause for us to rejoice and be glad.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Easter, let us make sure the words of our Gospel for this Solemnity is echoing in our ears and lived in our lives. St. John proclaims, "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, 'they have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him.' Peter and John ran to the tomb. Peter went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered His head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the scripture that He had to rise from the dead." This beautiful proclamation by John was an eyewitness of the reality of the resurrection of Jesus. And the statement by John as they saw this empty tomb was that they saw and believed. I only hope that we, who rely upon this eyewitness account, also see with the eyes of faith and truly believe. If this eyewitness account was not reality, why would the apostles and so many of those who succeeded them be willing to put their lives on the line for a fictional account. They wouldn't be, nor would it be logical to die for someone whose story of the resurrection was just made up. Instead, they saw, believed, and preached it even to the point of dying for this Savior of world, who suffered for our sins, and who rose that all of us would have life eternal. May this Easter mystery help to make the resurrection a reality for us, and pray that because of Easter, we put our faith in this person who conquered sin and death and reestablished our proper relationship with the God who loves us.

As we celebrated Holy Week, the liturgy of the Church came alive in all of our liturgies, One of the reasons for this lived experience was the environment created in all of our liturgies. And so I am very thankful to our decorating committee for their labors of love; very thankful to our musicians, cantors, and choirs who helped tell the story of this week; very thankfully to our lectors, servers, and our parishioners who shared in this liturgy of the Church. I also thank Frericks for the lilies as well as all our parishioners who remembered their loved ones through a donation for our decorations. I know I am a little prejudiced, but I am so gratefully to this parish family for helping us celebrate our Sacred Liturgies in this time termed Holy Week and Easter.

On behalf of Fr. Zach and myself, our deacons and staff, I want to wish each and every one of you a very Blessed and Happy Easter! Christ has risen!

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and our diocese have joined together in a nationwide effort called *Walking with Moms in Need: A Year of Service*. For our diocese, we will begin this process in late April, after Easter Sunday. For this *Year of Service*, the USCCB has developed educational, pastoral, prayer, and action-oriented resources for parish use. These resources are available on our diocesan website. Our Office for Pro-Life Activities and Special Ministries will also be hosting monthly webinars to guide parish leaders through the *Year of Service* process. Visit https://dio.org/office-for-pro-life-activities-and-special-ministries/pro-life-activities-and-special-ministries-resources/wwmin/ to learn more.

Early feedback from stakeholders tells us that parish-led efforts to support pregnant and parenting mothers in need communicates and increases unity within a parish. It can initiate or improve upon the collaboration of those who work on social justice and pro-life efforts. Such an effort can also move the conversation from what sometimes seems like a partisan divide into pastoral unity. This *Year of Service* is a response to Pope Francis' repeated challenge to go to the margins and bring hope and help to those in need.

Every region is different, every community is unique, and every parish is one-of-a-kind. While there are various programs already providing direct assistance to pregnant mothers, the *Year of Service* will help parishes to know of other, not so obvious, outside resources available to help women in need.

I invite your parish to participate in this Walking with Moms in Need: Year of Service initiative. The website noted above provides simple instructions and suggestions. Phase I merely consists of appointing a parish leader, introducing the *Year of Service* to the parish and inviting them to participate, and praying for mothers.

Our diocesan contact person for the *Year of Service* is Donna Moore at dmoore@dio.org. She will be contacting you shortly to follow up on my invitation. She will also be sharing a list of potential resources for pregnant women in need that we have identified at the diocesan level. A number of these may be helpful contacts for your parish leaders in identifying local resources.

Thank you for your kind attention to this invitation to join parishes across our diocese, and across the county, in this nationwide effort to better support pregnant and parenting women in desperate need, and to better communicate the help that is available. With every best wish. I remain
