

The Seven Last Words by Bishop Fulton Sheen

"It seems to be a fact of human psychology that when death approaches, the human heart speaks its words of love to those whom it holds closest and dearest. There is no reason to suspect that it is otherwise in the case of the Heart of hearts. If He spoke in a graduated order to those whom He loved most, then we may expect to find in His first three words the order of His love and affection. His first words went out to enemies: "Father, forgive them," His second to sinners, "This day you will be with me in Paradise," His third to saints: "Woman, behold your son." Enemies, sinners, and saints: such is the order of Divine Love and Thoughtfulness. The congregation anxiously awaited His first word...." (These words from Bishop Sheen will be continued in the coming weekends.)

Divine Mercy Holy Hour, St. Mary Church, Hamilton, This Sunday: The Hour of Mercy, 3 p.m.

About the Mass with the Priest Facing the Same Direction as You. I don't know how many times it has to be said: we're not going to change anything! We're not going to change anything! One more time....We're not going to change anything! We want your reaction of whatever kind; and we're presenting this way of the Mass to "head off at the pass" any sense of discounting other people because of their preference for a type of Mass. It's coming one more time, later in May. Your choice, not to come: but what I would hope is that you would be present, experience your reaction, and let me know about it. If only an emotional response: it's important to know. I would hope you could share more about whether it helps or hurts your prayer, your spirituality, and your own participation at the Mass. You have nothing to lose by letting me know your reaction. There's nothing to be pinned on you, because nothing is going to change. The only change is the opportunity for you to offer your reaction, based on your own experience. Fr. T.
