Acts 2:42-47; 1 Peter 1:3-9;
John 20:19-31

Everyone *should* be a saint! By our baptism, we became children of God, heirs of heaven, temples of the Holy Spirit, members of Christ's Body, sharers in God's own life. We *should* always live in accordance with our dignity.

Our first reading describes an idyllic picture of the primitive Church. Everyone shared with everyone else. Very likely this is an overly ideal picture. That's the way the Church *should* work, but unfortunately the Church consists of human beings.

The second reading describes the dignity of our "new birth" by baptism. We are heirs of an imperishable inheritance, but we won't enjoy it fully in this life; it is reserved for us in heaven. Meanwhile, we may have to suffer many things – as Jesus did. This is to perfect and to purify our faith. Let us rejoice even when we are called to suffer for the sake of Christ Jesus.

The Gospel tells of Doubting Thomas. He came to belief because he touched the wounds of Jesus. Jesus says that we are blessed who believe even though we haven't seen.

But there is more to the Gospel. If we fail our baptismal promises through human weakness, we can rise up again. If everything is not perfect, at least it is perfectible. We have "second baptism" – the forgiveness of sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance (Confession.)

Christ gave the power to forgive sins to his apostles and their successors and cooperators, the priests. He forgives us through their ministry. If we find that we aren't perfect, we need to make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation frequently.

A letter from Seminarian Sam Doellman

St. Francis family,

Happy Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday! I hope you and your families have had a blessed time rejoicing in the resurrection of our Lord. I was very blessed to share in the rejoicing with many of you this past weekend while serving Good Friday services, the Easter Vigil, and the 9 a.m. Sunday mass. Seeing our beautiful church full throughout this special time of year is such a joyous sight!

In today's gospel, we hear the familiar story about Thomas. How often can we place ourselves in the sandals of Thomas, doubting God until we "see for ourselves?" I can think of many times in my life that I am in his place. One specific instance of great doubt was last year when I was feeling the call to join seminary. I doubted that was truly what God was asking of me and wanted to "see" a clear sign from God.

Well, as many of you know, I am now a seminarian for our Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. I have spent the last year in priestly formation at Bishop Simon Bruté College Seminary in Indianapolis, IN. Throughout this year, I have been formed through different aspects of human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral development, all centered around discerning the call of priesthood for my life. This development has provided me a great amount of growth in not only my faith life, relationship with God, and emotional growth, but also a clearer vision of where God is calling me in my life. At this time, I am being called to leave seminary.

In the same way God was calling me to join seminary a year ago, I now feel I am called to leave. By no means has this time been anything of a waste! I have learned so much about myself and our church during this time. I feel ready to be able to come back and be an asset for the continued growth of St. Francis and our Catholic community in Quincy. Additionally, I feel convicted to be a witness for our young people to the great opportunities the discernment of priesthood and religious life provides. Not only do we need more holy priests and religious sisters, but we need more holy Catholics. If there is something I have learned about discernment, it is that no time is wasted. I would encourage anyone to just place trust in the Lord and go! Our God provides and that is something I often have to remind myself, just like Thomas.

There is no way that I could sufficiently express the gratitude I have for each and every one of you. Thank you for the unconditional love, prayers, support, and encouragement. I have been overwhelmed and humbled throughout the year by the generosity of the people of God. I have received prayers and support from people I have never met and may never meet. Without your support, it would not have been a reality for me to pick up my life for a year to discern the will of God for my life. Please continue to support vocations. Our church needs more holy people willing to place full trust in our Lord's abundance.

Please keep me in your prayers as I continue this transition and know of my prayers for you in return. I look forward to coming back to the parish at the conclusion of this semester. As for what my plans are? Well, I'm not sure. That's up to God to decide!

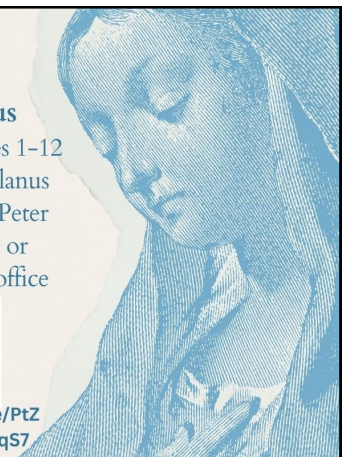

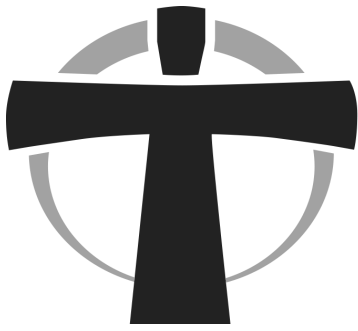
