From "The Seven Last Words," by Fulton Sheen: Part II

"Enemies, sinners, and saints - such is the order of Divine Love and Thoughtfulness. The congregation anxiously awaited His first word. The executioners expected Him to cry, for every one pinned on the gibbet of the Cross had done it before Him. Seneca tells us that those who were crucified cursed the day of their birth, the executioners, their mothers, and even spat on those who looked upon them. Cicero tells us that at times it was necessary to cut out the tongues of those who were crucified, to stop their 'kind of cry that they heard'. The scribes and Pharisees expected a cry, too, and they were quite sure that He who had preached 'Love your enemies' and 'Do good to those who hate you,' would now forget that Gospel with the piercing of feet and hands. They felt that the excruciating and agonizing pains would scatter to the winds any resolution He might have taken to keep up appearances...." (Conclusion, next week.)
