Third Sunday of Easter

APRIL 23, 2023

Acts 2:14,22-33; 1 Peter 1:17-21;
Luke 24:13-35

One “key word” is found in each of the Scripture readings of today’s Mass and in the Responsorial Psalm. It is the word *path*. (In the second reading and Gospel it is translated “way.”) The conclusion of the first reading is: “You have shown me the *paths* of life.” Our Responsorial Psalm refrain is: “Lord, you will show us the path of life.” In the second reading Peter says, “You were delivered from your futile *path* of life...by Christ’s own blood.” In the Gospel, two disciples are on the *path* to Emmaus.

Very likely most of us have experienced a post-Easter let-down. This was in evidence last Sunday when our attendance was about half of what it was on Easter Sunday! Some have gone back to their old *path* of life already. We’ve been on a “high,” and now we settle back down to the drudgery of daily existence. It must not be so! Christ has risen; he is with us! Our *path* of life must be different!

The two on the path to Emmaus were *disciples*, not *apostles*. A disciple is a follower, a learner, one who studies to become like his master. Perhaps these followers did not recognize Jesus because they had never seen him! They followed him because of the proclamation of good news. But now, it seemed as if their world had collapsed; they went down the path to Emmaus in dejection and desperation.

Jesus opened their minds to the Scriptures. But still they didn’t realize his presence. They finally recognized him “in the breaking of the bread.” The Gospel wants us to understand that we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. “The breaking of the bread” was the ancient name for the Mass or the Eucharist.

The risen Lord Jesus can deliver us from our futile paths of life. He is always present to us in his word and in his sacrament. But we must come out of ourselves to find him. We must look up and out. Let us renew our realization of the presence of the risen Lord each day. And let us realize that he truly will show us the path of life.

Third Sunday of Easter, April 23, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

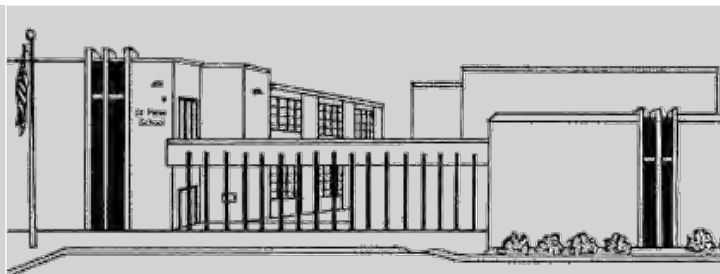
This weekend, we continue our celebration of the Easter mystery as we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter. In our gospel this weekend, we hear of the risen Jesus' presence to the disciples as they walked the road to Emmaus. In this experience, two disciples were conversing on their way all that had happened to them over the past several days. Perhaps they were sharing their experiences with each other. To their surprise, a stranger drew near them and started walking with them. He asked of them what they were discussing. This led them to sharing about this man Jesus the Nazarene whom they were hoping would be the one to redeem Israel. And then they shared with this stranger what they experienced in the empty tomb and how others had seen Jesus risen and alive. Then this stranger opened up the Old Testament Scriptures for these two disciples. Thus they seemed to celebrate what we call the Liturgy of the Word. After this explanation, these two disciples invited this stranger to stay with them and that he did. Then, "while He was with them at table, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized Him." Thus the Liturgy of the Eucharist was being celebrated with this stranger. Filled with joy and hearts burning within them, they returned to Jerusalem where they shared with the apostles this experience and how the risen Lord was made known to them in the breaking of the bread. (Term for the Eucharist in the early Church).

Next Saturday, April 29, our third grade students from our parish will be going to the Cathedral in Springfield, to celebrate the completion of their sacraments of Initiation. The Bishop will confirm these students and then give to them their First Holy Communion. Please keep these young people in your prayers as this is an important day in their sacramental lives. Then the next day, Sunday April 30, we will gather with them here at St. Peter Church at the 11:00 a.m. Mass to celebrate their second Holy Communion with their home parish family. Congratulations and prayers for each of them. I do want to thank their parents for helping to prepare them for this day, along with their teachers, Pam Hagerbaumer, Cindy Brown, Amanda Miller, and Sandy Gallaher, as well as Gina Bergman, our director of religious education. Thank you to all of you for getting our young ones ready.

Also, during the Lenten season, with the Sacrament of Reconciliation being offered on Monday, Wednesday, and Fridays, our second grade students were able to receive their First Confession with their parents. I also thank our parents, who were willing teachers and models of faith, for helping us in their role as teachers of faith. I also thank our teachers, Becky McCutchen, Emily Mellon, and our DRE, Gina Bergman. May they use this sacrament frequently and experience God's forgiveness and their newness of heart.

For those who have been using the Rice Bowl on their tables during Lent for almsgiving, I ask you to return them either by placing the bowl in the basket in front of the ambo, or placing a check or the cash equivalent for what you contributed in an envelope and putting it into the collection basket. Your almsgiving for the poor is greatly appreciated. Thank you for thinking of those in need.

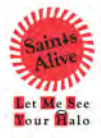
