Next Saturday/Sunday May 6-7 we will offer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at all Masses. We last offered this sacrament in November, so it would be good to offer this sacrament again after six months.

With this week's arrival of May is also the Church's celebration of **May Crowning**. We will have our BSS May Crowning this **Thursday May 4 after the 8:15 a.m. School Mass**. I encourage our families to celebrate May Crowning in your own homes by praying the rosary together as a family. We crown Mary as queen of our universal Church and our parish, but also as the queen of our homes and families.

On Saturday May 13 from 8-9 a.m., we will host a Eucharistic Holy Hour to Pray for Vocations. During this Holy Hour we will have special readings and prayers in which we will offer particular intercessions for the Lord to call forth those He is inviting to the vocations of priesthood and consecrated life. On Saturday evening May 27 at the 4:30 p.m. Mass we will celebrate the **Extended Form of the Pentecost Vigil**. The Extended Form gives us the opportunity to "pray in vigil" for the coming of the Holy Spirit, much as Mary and the Apostles did at the original Pentecost. The Pentecost Vigil has an extended Liturgy of the Word:

The Rites of Full Communion of our RCIA Candidates will also take place in this liturgy through the celebration of the Rites of Reception, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion. Finally, this upcoming **Wednesday May 3** I will be in Springfield in the afternoon/evening for the annual **Priest Jubilee Celebration** at the Villa Maria Retreat Center. At this annual event, the priests of the Diocese gather with Bishop Thomas Paprocki to celebrate the priesthood anniversaries of our brother priests. Please join us for May Crowning Thursday, May 4 after 8:15 a.m. School Mass in the Grotto

May Crowning is a traditional Roman Catholic ritual held during the month of May.

It is a solemn procession to the Blessed Virgin Mother where she is crowned with flowers honoring her as "The Queen of May."

The queen symbol was attributed to Mary because she was a perfect follower of Christ, who is the absolute "crown" of creation. She is the Queen of Heaven and of our lives. We entrust all our intentions to her, and she takes them to her Son, who is the King.

The maid of Nazareth consented to God's plan; she journeyed on the pilgrimage of faith; she listened to God's Word and kept it in her heart; she remained steadfastly in close union with her Son, all the way to the foot of the Cross; she persevered in prayer with the Church. Thus, in a way she won the "crown of righteousness" (II Tim 4:8), the "crown of life" (Jas 1:12; Rev 2:10), the "crown of glory" (I Pet 5:4) that is promised to those who follow Christ.


