

The Seven Last Words by Fulton Sheen: Part III

"(The scribes and Pharisees expected a cry, too, and they were quite sure that Jesus...would now forget that Gospel with the piercing of feet and hands. They felt that the excruciating and agonizing pains would scatter to the winds any resolution He might have taken to keep up appearances.) Everyone expected a cry, but no one - with the exception of the three at the foot of the Cross - expected the cry they *did* hear. Like some fragrant trees which bathe in perfume the very axe which gnashes them, the great Heart on the Tree of Love poured out from its depths something less a cry than a prayer, the soft, sweet low prayer of pardon and forgiveness: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."
Here's a question for you: if you've ever made up your mind that there are some things you can never forgive, how does that line up with the Judgement Day Review of the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."?
