Fourth Sunday of Easter

APRIL 30, 2023

Acts 2:14a,36-41; 1 Peter 2:20b-25; John 10:1-10

Today is usually called "Good Shepherd Sunday." But the metaphors in today's Scripture readings speak of Jesus in other terms also. The first reading is the first sermon in the Church; it is given by Peter. He accuses the Jerusalem populace of complicity in crucifying Jesus. He declares that God has raised him from the dead and made him Lord and Messiah.

Peter does not enter into a theological discussion of the pre-existence of Christ, nor of the Incarnation. He simply says that by the resurrection, Jesus effectively is made Lord and Messiah. He is more than the promise made to Israel; he is Lord.

The second reading speaks of Jesus as a lamb led to the slaughter. He did not resist, did not cry out. There are allusions here to the Suffering Servant Songs of Isaiah. He offered himself as the Lamb of God to the Father, and by his wounds, we are healed. Then the author changes the metaphor: We were the straying sheep, but now we have returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls.

The first part of the Gospel speaks of the shepherd who leads his sheep. The sheep will follow only their own shepherd. Jesus is that Good Shepherd who provides for our needs, who protects us, who binds up our wounds, who searches for us when we are lost, who leads us and guides us. The second part of the Gospel changes the metaphor: Jesus is now the gate of the sheep enclosure. All must go in through him. Elsewhere in John, Jesus says that he is the "way."

Whatever the metaphors, the meaning is clear: The Lord Jesus Christ must be the meaning of our lives. We must see every aspect of our lives in the context of Christ. Our salvation, our forgiveness, our advancement on the way to the Father all come through, with, and in Christ. He is shepherd, Lamb of God, and gate of the sheepfold. He is Messiah and Lord. He is the way, the truth, and our life

This weekend, we gather on this last weekend of April to celebrate the 4th Sunday of Easter. As we close out this month, let's hope that the old saying rings true, "April showers bring May flowers." Looking forward to seeing the beauty of creation in the flowers of May.


As we celebrate this 4th Sunday, the Church summarizes this weekend with a responsorial psalm that is very familiar to all of us as it quotes Psalm 23. In that Psalm, we proclaim that: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want." Although most of us have not seen a true shepherd for shepherding is not something we see in this area. Nevertheless, we have this image of a person who cares, tends, and protects the sheep in whose care this person has. It is more than just a job for a shepherd and is not confined to a 9-5 experience but rather a full time 24 hour ministry of care, feeding, and protecting. Because of this image that we have of a shepherd, the one role that seems to fulfill that image is leadership in the Church, whether it be our Pope, our Bishop, or even our priests. These people are ordained to that role of being a shepherd. They are to lead, protect, and feed the very people, sheep, in whom they watch over. And so I ask your continual prayers for the shepherds of our Church.

On behalf of the parish family, I want to congratulate our parishioners from St. Peter who celebrated their Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist at the Cathedral in Springfield this Saturday, April 29. Our prayers, love, and support are with them. We will have a special celebration of their second Eucharist this Sunday at the 11:00 a.m. Mass.

Ever since COVID, we have been limited to the ways that we have distributed Holy Communion for fear of spreading this disease. In fact, for many of us since our return to normalcy, we have still limited the way that we distribute Holy Communion to the faithful, only offering it under one species, that of the Body of Christ. People have been asking when we can return to the distribution of Holy Communion under both species, the Body and Blood of Christ. In order for us to begin the process of getting ministers once again for distribution, we will begin our distribution under both species on the weekend of June 10-11, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. This gives us the opportunity to make sure our ministers are in place as we will be needing six at each weekend Mass, seven if we do not have a deacon. Thanks for being so patient. For those who still have a problem with the distribution under the cup for fear of germs, know that you do not have to receive under this form.

This Wednesday, May 3, the priests of the diocese will be gathering in Springfield for their annual Jubilee Day. This day honors various priests on their jubilee years (25, 50, 60, 65 years of ordination). This year, one of our jubilarians is Fr. Tom Meyer, the pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Quincy. Fr. Meyer will be celebrating his silver (25th) anniversary as a priest. I remember Fr. Meyer as his first assignment as a priest was with me as my parochial vicar at St. Anthony Church, Effingham. I ask you to remember Fr. Meyer in your prayers as also the other jubilarians who are celebrating many years of service to the Church.
