From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the 6^{th} Sunday of Easter. Jesus says in the gospel today, "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me." In our culture today love is often understood as a feeling or emotion. The risen Christ has a deeper understanding of love; a love that contains the virtues of commitment and trusting obedience. May we seek to grow in this love that reaches beyond human feeling.

During the next 10 days (Monday, May 15 – Wednesday, May 24) we will be **Closing the Parish and School Parking Lot during School Hours (7:45 a.m.-3:00 p.m.)** in order to "pilot" a plan we hope to implement next School Year to improve School Safety for our School Children. Next Sunday May 21 at 10:00 a.m. Mass we will honor all **Parish Graduating H.S. Seniors from the Class of 2023.** A small reception will be held for them in the Gathering Space following our 10:00 a.m. liturgy. Congratulations to our Graduating Senior Class of 2023!

This month of May we encourage members to give to our semi-annual Collection for our **Quincy Catholic Cemeteries.** Monies from this collection help provide ongoing care and support to our parish cemeteries. Please place your contributions in the Cemetery Care envelope found in your monthly packet.



Three Simple Ways to Honor Mary on Mother's Day!*





As the Mother of Jesus and mother of all Christians, I can imagine Mary not wanting to make a fuss about the attention we give her. And at the same time, I can imagine her treasuring our simple efforts. And so let us leap at the chance to honor and celebrate this beautiful mother of ours. **Here are three simple ways we can honor Mary this Mother's Day:**

- **Pray the Rosary.** Take a few moments, either alone or with your family, to pray the Rosary. If it's a nice day outside, go for a Rosary walk! If an entire Rosary seems overwhelming to you, consider praying just one decade. (Join the Blessed Sacrament Parish Facebook Page @ 9:00 p.m. every night.)
- **Bring Mary Flowers.** During May (the month of Mary), it is customary to set up an extra-special space in your home to honor Our Lady. A Mary altar doesn't have to be fancy. It can be simple but beautiful atop a fireplace mantle or bookshelf. If you don't have a statue of Mary, a framed holy card and Rosary can adorn your altar. Get the children/grandchildren involved by asking them to make little bouquets of flowers for the Blessed Mother.
- **Enjoy Dessert.** What holiday is complete without a special treat? And the Catholic Church is very good about teaching us about the importance of fasting *and* feasting! While Mother's Day might not be an official Marian feast day, she is the mother of all mothers, so let us celebrate her! And perhaps instead of "Happy Birthday," we could sing a Marian hymn instead!

Panic Attack vs. Anxiety Attack : Is there a difference and what are the symptoms?

The terms panic attack and anxiety attack are oftentimes used interchangeably by those unfamiliar with them, but it's important to know that they aren't actually the same. According to the National Institute for Mental Health, "panic attacks are sudden periods of intense fear that come on quickly and reach their peak within minutes. Panic attacks can occur unexpectedly or can be brought on by a trigger.


Anxiety on the other hand, happens gradually after a period of excessive worry. "If the anticipation of something builds up and the high amount of stress reaches a level where it becomes overwhelming, it may feel like an "attack". Also, it comes down to the physical sensations in your body that determine whether you are experiencing a panic attack as opposed to anxiety attack.

Ultimately, while both feel very real & scary in the moment, it is important to remember the feelings are temporary & will not last forever. Many therapists & psychiatrists recommend keeping a coping toolbox to help deal with stressful times.

A coping toolbox is essentially a box filled with items & notes of coping strategies to help oneself calm down & express their emotions in a healthy way. So find a box (any old shoe box, food container or something that is easy to store). Next week we will give coping strategies to fill your coping toolbox.


