

"On the Q / T..."

From the Devotional, *God Calling, A. J. Russel, ed., May 9th meditation:* "Doubt of your own wisdom, and reliance on mine, will teach you humility. Humility is not the belittling of the self. It is forgetting the self. Nay more, forgetting the self, because you are remembering me. You must not expect to live in a world where all is harmony. You must not expect to live where others are in unbroken accord with you. It is your task to maintain your own heart peace in adverse circumstances....Only my wisdom can rightly decide anything - settle any problem. So, rely on me...."

On to the Question from Fr. Tony:

There are certain "code words," certain "code sayings" that let you and me know what are true dispositions are, despite any insistence to the contrary. For example: "I'm humble; why, I'm probably the most humble person on earth." So: you're not humble. "I've died to myself, over and over again, just as Jesus has said to die to yourself." Probably you're still very much alive! Humility is the honest estimation of yourself: the truth, without any fanfare, spotlight, attention hoarding. Sometimes, even that doesn't help, because modern day attention to self-esteem, self-concept, and the aversion to listening to people run themselves down, all have a tendency to confuse and even prevent an honest evaluation of self. So how about a question that goes like this: where have you seen humility in action? How has humility looked to you, when it came your way?
