Sixth Sunday of Easter

MAY 14, 2023

Acts 8:5-8,14-17; 1 Peter 3:15-18; John 14:15-21

In Hebrew, Greek, and Latin, the word "Spirit" is onomatopoeiac; it sounds like what it means. The word really means "breath." In Hebrew, it is *ruach*; in Greek, *pneuma*; in Latin, *spiritus*. The concept, of course, is that when a person is breathing, he is alive.

In former times, when a person was in a coma, a mirror or glass would be placed in front of his nose or mouth to see if there was any "breath." If there was breath, he was alive; if not, he was dead. From this notion, the idea of an animating, life-giving, intelligent and active force came. The word (in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin) thus meant "breath", "life" and "spirit." Jewish tradition believed that, when the Messiah came, God's very own life (breath, spirit) would be poured out upon all faithful believers.

This happened at Pentecost, as we have seen. But it happens also among us. In the Gospel, Jesus promised that he would not leave us orphans; he would send the Spirit of truth, the Paraclete, to remain with us and to be within us. The word "paraclete" means many things. It can mean comforter. It can mean a person who stands by you and helps you in time of need. And it can mean a "defense attorney." Very likely, it means all these things. The Holy Spirit gives us life, stands by us, defends us, strengthens us, and consoles us.

The first reading tells of the manner in which we receive the Holy Spirit: It is the sacrament of Confirmation. The apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God; the Samaritans had been baptized, but had not yet received the Spirit. The apostles Peter and John were sent to them to impose hands on them so that they might receive the Holy Spirit.

Through the imposition of the hands of the successors of the apostles (bishops), we also receive the Holy Spirit. We are empowered to profess our faith boldly, to bear witness to the truth of the Lord, and to stand for what is right and good. We receive the Spirit's consolation in our difficulties.

The second reading tells us to be faithful, even when we are misunderstood. Even if others ridicule us and defame us, keep standing for what is right. Keep our consciences clear. It is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Christ did no wrong, but suffered even to death on the cross. If we are willing to suffer for him and with him, God will see us through and will vindicate us. Meanwhile, we have the consolation of the Holy Spirit who lives in our hearts.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent support communications projects in the United States and around the world. Let me share with you some examples that show the impact of your generosity to the CCC.

Over the past year, our diocese had several big announcements and news stories that were important for the people of our diocese to know. This included the Norbertine Fathers of St. Michael's Abbey opening up the Evermode Institute July 1 of this year, the diocesan Year of the Eucharist going on now, the Eucharistic Congress happening this October, the Illinois March for Life occurring in Springfield for the first time in March, honoring the life and legacy of Pope Benedict XVI after his death, and the countless stories of conversion, inspiration, and faith of people in our diocese.

Through Catholic Times, social media, podcasting, and other digital methods, our diocese is taking advantage of several communication outlets to spread the news of our diocese, teach the faith, and provide hope and encouragement to people no matter where they are in their faith life.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels continue to grow. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese. For example, our Facebook page surpassed 10,000 followers over the past year (we had about 3.000 followers four years ago). In 2020, our YouTube channel had under 500 subscribers. Today, it has more than 3,000. This shows that the content our curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them.

For example, a search on You Tube for "How to go to Confession," has a video from our diocese in the top five for answering that question. Dive Deep, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, has listeners all over the world, and recently interviewed Father Mike Schmitz that attracted nearly 70,000 views. In July this year, an original documentary, created and produced by our curia team, will premiere. God is Alive tells five stories of miraculous events/ incredible faith stories in five different cities in Central Illinois that will boost people's spiritual lives.

With your generosity, we can continue creating engaging content and bring people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.


