

Lessons in the Meaning of Pentecost from Sts. Peter and Paul School

It must have been weird. You're in a huge crowd of people drawn to the sound of an incredibly strong wind, aware that there are multiple languages and dialects represented there, and everybody's listening to twelve men, each being understood in the languages and dialects representing that crowd! OK: a miracle. Weird, if you were there: really weird. And yet, something wonderful is happening. A new family, a new nation, a new kingdom is being spoken into existence: the Church. As a result of the breakdown in communication at the Tower of Babel in the Old Testament, nations had to make the effort to understand each other and work together. Sts. Peter and Paul School is like that: many voices, distinct, occasionally in conflict, but always with the understanding that there's an obligation to make the effort to work together and understand each other. Many gifts of the Holy Spirit make that happen. "All the parts of the Body, many though they are, are one Body." "There are different forms of service, but the same Lord." Sts. Peter and Paul School is an ongoing work of the Holy Spirit.

And we disperse. Ten minutes: but best spent time to honor those that because of their sacrifice and love of country, we enjoy the gift of freedom and its responsibility.
