*Pentecost

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13;
John 20:19-23

The Greek word “pentecostes” means “fiftieth.” On the fiftieth day after Passover, Jews celebrated the “Feast of Weeks” or “Pentecost.” The celebration commemorated the Covenant of Mt. Sinai. Fifty days after leaving Egypt, the Israelites arrived at Mt. Sinai. There they encountered the Lord in fire and wind and quaking. There the Lord gave them his Holy Law, and they pledged that they would be loyal to him.

At the time of Jesus, this festival also had “overtones” of the inclusion of non-Jews (Gentiles) in salvation. They believed that somehow the Lord would bring all peoples and nations to worship him at his holy temple.

With this background, we can appreciate the powerful coming of the Holy Spirit fifty days after Easter. The “signs” of quaking and fire recall the covenant of Sinai; this is the inauguration of the new covenant! The apostles had expected that everything would be perfect when Jesus came again in glory.

He comes in the Holy Spirit with power and changes timid men into bold men; he changes the crass into the wise; he changes the weak into the strong; and the sinful into the holy ones. They are not perfect, but they are to be the loyal witnesses to Christ. They go forth to proclaim that salvation has come to all peoples. The various groups mentioned in the first reading are a summary of all the peoples known in the Mediterranean world.

The Church is made up of imperfect people; otherwise there would be no need for the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance described in the Gospel. But we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to become faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. Each of us has received unique and distinct gifts of the Holy Spirit. The Lord calls us to use these for the common good and for the building up of the Church in the unity of love.

Let us rejoice in this “birthday of the Church.” Let us renew our commitment to use our gifts to spread the good news of Jesus Christ to every person.

Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023

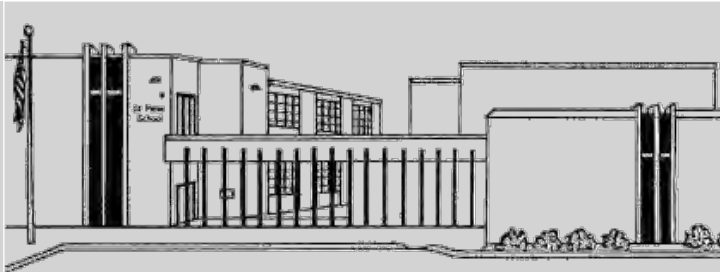
Dear Parishioners,

This past month of May has been so busy as there are many practices and games, final exams, graduations, and the end of the school year parties and celebrations. On the one hand, there is joy among our youth as they get a three month break from their school routines. There is also joy among our teachers who get this respite from a very tiring year. As far as the parents of our young people, needless to say they will be kept quite busy meeting the needs of their young people throughout the summer months. I just want to reemphasize as I did last week that there is no vacation from their vocation as Catholics. I still expect the parents and their children present at Masses on the weekends. Some may say that they have sporting events for their children in other places than Quincy. To them I say, there are many Catholic Churches that will be celebrating Masses in the areas in which you will find yourselves. So there is not excuse. I remind you as parents, you are your students first teachers in the ways of faith, be the best of teachers. I challenge you to make your faith a priority this summer as that is the role of a witness for our faith.

As we celebrate this last weekend of the month of May, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost. This Solemnity brings to a conclusion our Easter season. As we celebrate this Solemnity, we hear the words from the Acts of the Apostles, professing this Solemnity: *“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.”* With the celebration of Pentecost, the promised Advocate, the Holy Spirit, enters into the lives of the apostles and disciples, thus changing them from timid, fearful individuals, to a community of believers, staunch in their faith and courageous in their willingness to proclaim that faith. That same Holy Spirit continues to fill our Churches today, molding us and fashioning us to be those same type of witnesses. It is this Holy Spirit received at Confirmation that helps us to live our faith with His gifts that He gives to us, gifts of Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Fortitude (Courage), Right Judgement (Counsel), Reverence (Piety), Wonder and Awe (Fear of the Lord). Today we pray the words of our Responsorial Psalm, “Lord send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.”

This Monday, May 29, is a national holiday called Memorial Day. As is our custom we will join with all the Catholic Churches of the area to celebrate together a Mass at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 a.m. It will be the only Mass for us here at St. Peter. We invite you to bring your lawn chairs and/or blankets to this Mass to be celebrated in front of the chapel. In case of inclement weather, we will move it to St. Peter Church. We are responsible for the liturgy for the day. I also ask you to look around the cemetery and see some of the new roads added. There is a lot of capital improvements taking place and we are only able to do this work through your generosity. Please consider supporting our Catholic cemeteries this Memorial Day. I am sure that many of you have seen the report from our Attorney General Kwame Raoul who recently has released his final report concerning the sexual abuse of minors by clergy. Social media as well as other media have picked this up and reported it as if it were current. Not making excuses, but this is old news, but it still hurts both professionally and personally. This report reveals incidences that happened over 20 years ago and unveils once again the scarred and flawed humanity of some members of our clergy. I have personally known many of these men, have even served with them in my years as a priest. It is always with sadness in my heart that we have to confront and admit our failures. To the many people affected, I am truly sorry. Some of the priests reported served in the Quincy area and we pray for God's healing and forgiveness to all who have been hurt and traumatized by such sinful behavior. Like any sins of the past, only God can heal and help us find peace once again in our lives. To all who have been hurt, and to those who have hurt others, may all find strength in our God.
