Acts 6:1-7; 1 Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12

The first reading tells of the ordination of the first deacons of the Church. Their primary function is to minister the charity of the Church. The reading tells us that the number of disciples at Jerusalem enormously increased. The Church is growing. In its growth, the Church will need to cope with problems of administration, with answering many questions, and with a deepening awareness of its mission here on earth.

Very likely, the first Christians did not think that the Church would be around very long; they probably thought that Jesus was going to return in glory very soon. Gradually, however, they saw that the Church was intended to be here for the long term. They may have had some fears about this.

But as they reflected, they surely recalled that Jesus had sent the Holy Spirit to empower them to be his witnesses. He had gone to prepare a place for them, but he was still with them. He is the way, the truth, and the life. And the Holy Spirit manifests Christ to them.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells them that they have put faith in him and in the works he has done. But because he returns to the Father and sends them the Spirit, they will do even greater things than he has done! In the power of the Holy Spirit, the Church must continue the mission of Christ until he comes again.

The second reading recalls Psalm 118: Jesus is the stone rejected by the builders who has become the cornerstone, the capstone, of the structure. But it is more than stone: We are living stones being built into God's temple. We need to realize our dignity as the "new Israel."

In Exodus 19:6, God told Israel that it was a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. The author of 1 Peter goes even further: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people God claims for his very own."

If we are awed and frightened by our mission on earth, let us realize that the Lord is still with us. He has empowered us to be his faithful witnesses through the Holy Spirit. Let us be his instruments in the salvation of the world.

Fifth Sunday of Easter, May 7, 2023


Our gospel for this Fifth Sunday in our Easter season is one of my favorites and is often used at a funeral Mass. It starts off with Jesus saying to His disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in Me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be." Those words ring true each time that I celebrate a Funeral Mass. Those words ring true when sometimes life gives us lemons and we are about to give up because we lose hope. And those words ring true when we face death and realize that death is not the victor, but rather Christ is, and He promises that the resurrection and life eternal is our hope in spite of the crosses and trials of life. Then Jesus says to us, "Where I am going, you know the way." This is when Thomas speaks for us and says, "how can we know the way?" Then Jesus responds with those words to live by, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." I hope and pray that each of us finds strength, hope, and comfort in these words of Jesus for they are meant for all of us.

Last Saturday, we celebrated two of the Sacraments of Initiation for our students of St. Peter Church. These sacraments were celebrated by the Bishop for our students at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. I wasn't quite sure of celebrating them in this way but after the experience I have to honestly admit that it was a very nice celebration. Was it worth the trip to Springfield? I have to say, yes it was. Even though it might have been inconvenient for some, the celebration at the Cathedral was a lasting experience for our students and parents.

This Wednesday, May 10, we will be celebrating the closing Mass for our students who are attending our PSR program at 6:30 p.m. Students and parents are expected to be present. Even though we are breaking for the summer months, I remind our young people and parents that there is not break from their vocation as Catholics. You are expected each weekend to be present for our Eucharist as Jesus feeds us with His very Body and Blood.

Also, the Baccalaureate Mass for our QND students will be this Thursday, May 11, at St. Francis Solanus Church here in Quincy. Then our QND seniors will celebrate their graduation on Sunday, May 14, at the Quincy Notre Dame gym at 1:00 p.m. Our prayers and support are with our young graduates as we ask God to watch over them and protect them as they enter a new phase of their lives either as students or workers.
